



Washington Aggression Intervention Training (W.A.I.T.) for Elementary School Educators

**This session is intended to be only a brief overview of a full three day training offered in the near future.*

Washington Aggression Interruption Training (WAIT) elementary version is a social-emotional learning program designed to assist youth with interpersonal skills, self-control in dealing with anger, and the process of problem solving. WAIT is an intensive and impactful intervention, designed to promote prosocial skills, improve anger control and reduce the frequency of acting out behaviors. In the weekly sessions, participants gain tools that allow them to solve problems, make decisions, and interact positively in social situations. The curriculum consists of three components: Social Skills Training, Anger Control Training, and Problem Solving.
