### JOIN THE PILOT

60 participants will have the opportunity to become part of the pilot for the Leadership for Equity Micro-Credentials, which will launch at the ESSA conference.

#### REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Participate in an all-day training on Exploring and Deepening an Equity Mindset on March 19, 2020 at DuPage Regional Office of Education
- ✓ Participate in a follow-up Guiding Culturally Responsive Instructional Practice training via Micro-Credential (will have approximately 1 year to complete the Micro-Credential)
- ✓ Work at your own pace with the Guiding Culturally Responsive Instructional Practice Micro-Credential but must commit to complete Micro-Credential by March 20, 2021

#### REWARDS

- ✓ No cost to participate with the face to face training on March 19th and follow-up micro-credential
- ✓ Professional Development Credit (either 1 IAA per micro-credential or 30 PD hours per micro-credential)
- ✓ Recognition of completion of two micro-credentials on Illinois educator license
- ✓ Digital Badge through Bloomboard with completion of both micro-credentials

### OVERVIEW

The Center for the Study of Education Policy (CSEP) at Illinois State University has partnered with the Tennessee Department of Education, American Institutes for Research (AIR) and BloomBoard to develop the Leadership for Equity Micro-Credential Cluster. The LFE MC is based on Tennessee's Leadership for Equity Playbook (<https://www.tn.gov/content/dam/tn/education/reports/Tennessee-Leaders-for-Equity-Playbook.pdf>) and aligns with the Professional Standards for Educational Leadership (PSEL).

- ✓ externally trained assessors determine if competency has been reached
