The Illinois State Board of Education invites classroom teachers to deepen their understanding of how to teach and reach gifted and talented students. Identification and characteristics of the gifted learner will be explored in depth. The necessary components of programming, curriculum models, and differentiation will be stressed. The course will include ongoing discussion of tools to promote equity and diversity along with resources to support underserved populations. The seminar incorporates initial Knowledge and Skill Standards for Gifted and Talented Education from the Illinois Association for Gifted Children (IAGC) and the National Association for Gifted Children (NAGC). *The GES is an overview course and is not included in the course sequence for the Gifted Endorsement.
