The Armstrong-Indiana-Clarion Drug and Alcohol Commission's (AICDAC) Recovery HUB has a primary goal of providing training and technical assistance to Recovery Support Services Providers throughout Region 6 and Region 7 to enhance and expand Recovery Support Services.

The Recovery HUB works with Single County Authorities (SCAs), Recovery Community Organizations (RCOs), Grassroots Organizations, and other providers to provide FREE training and Technical Assistance that serves to enhance, expand, and promote recovery supports in Western Pennsylvania.

Our service area includes:

Region 6: Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Cambria, Greene, Fayette, Indiana, Somerset, Washington and Westmoreland counties

Region 7: Cameron, Clarion, Clearfield, Crawford, Elk, Forest, Jefferson, Lawrence, McKean, Mercer, Venango and Warren counties

Beginning in July, 2023 through December, 2023, the Recovery HUB collected input and data by conducting community Listening Sessions and Focus Groups throughout Regions 6 and 7.

The Recovery HUB completed Needs Assessments for the 22 county coverage area in January, 2024. Upon analysis of the needs assessments, the Recovery HUB was able to determine over-arching gaps in regard to Recovery Support Services and develop a Strategic Plan for each Region that includes 5 Priorities based on the input and data collected.

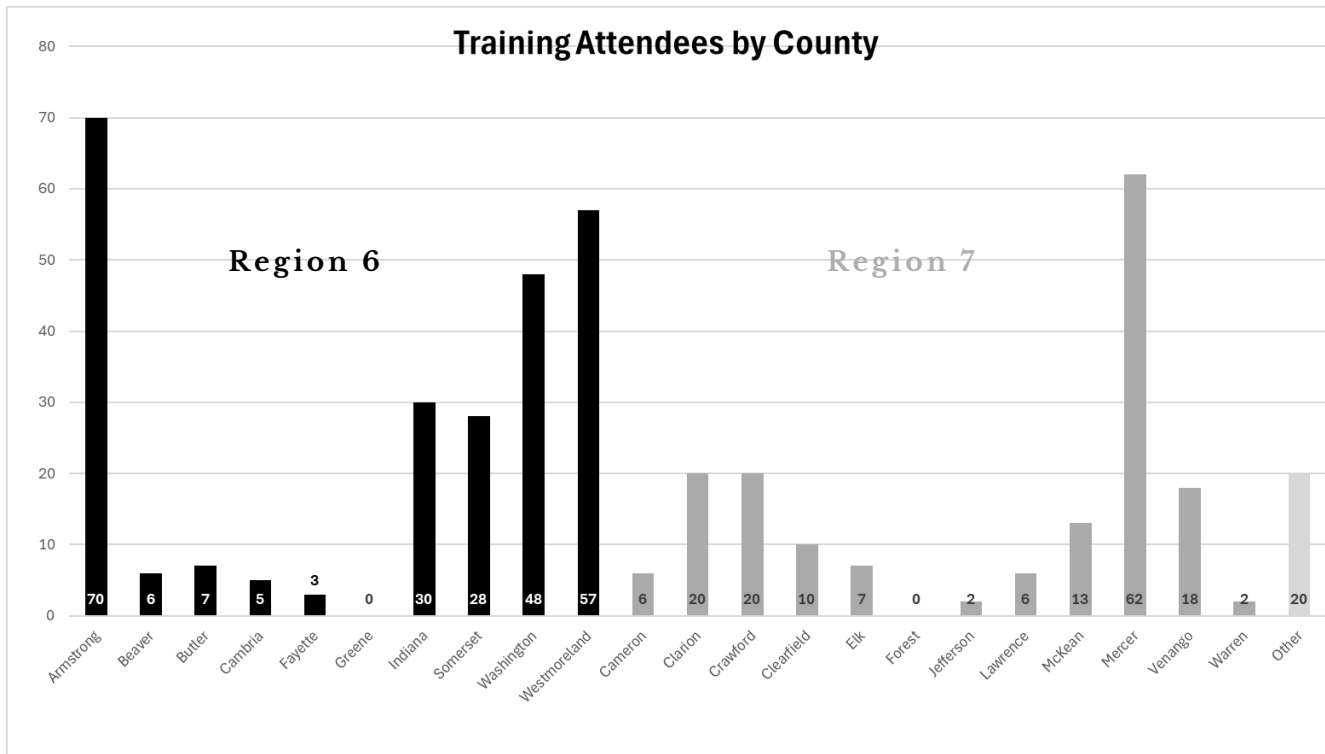
TRAINING OVERVIEW

AICDAC Recovery HUB began offering training in May, 2024. From May 6, 2024 through December 10, 2024, the Recovery HUB trained 440 individuals in 12 counties by providing 33 trainings totaling 442 training hours.



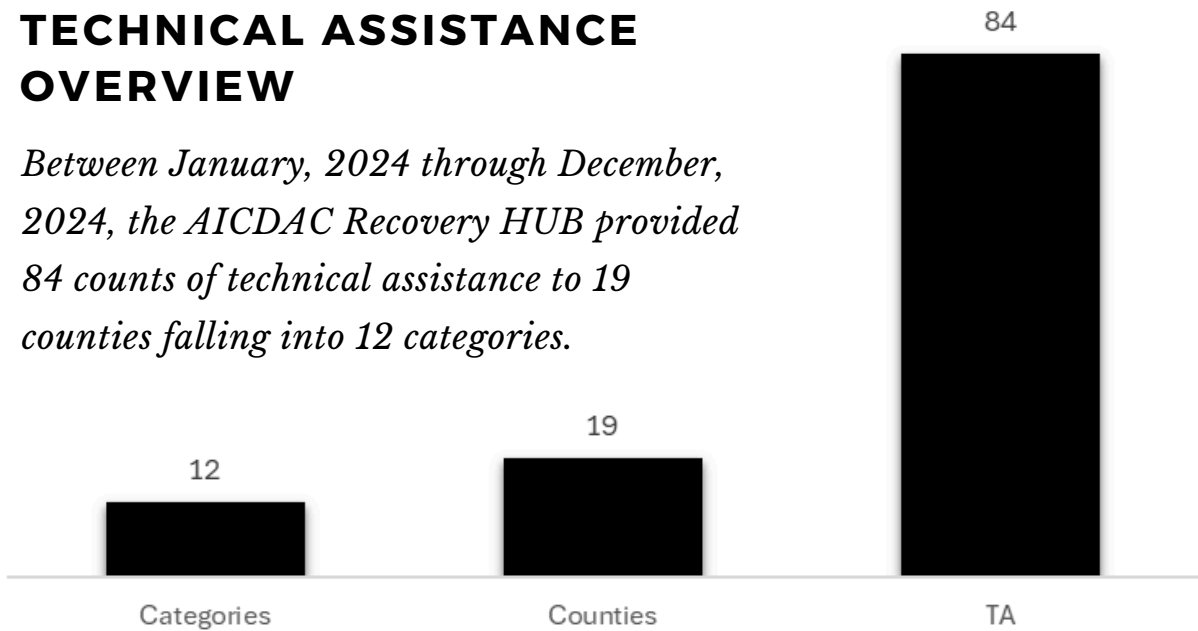

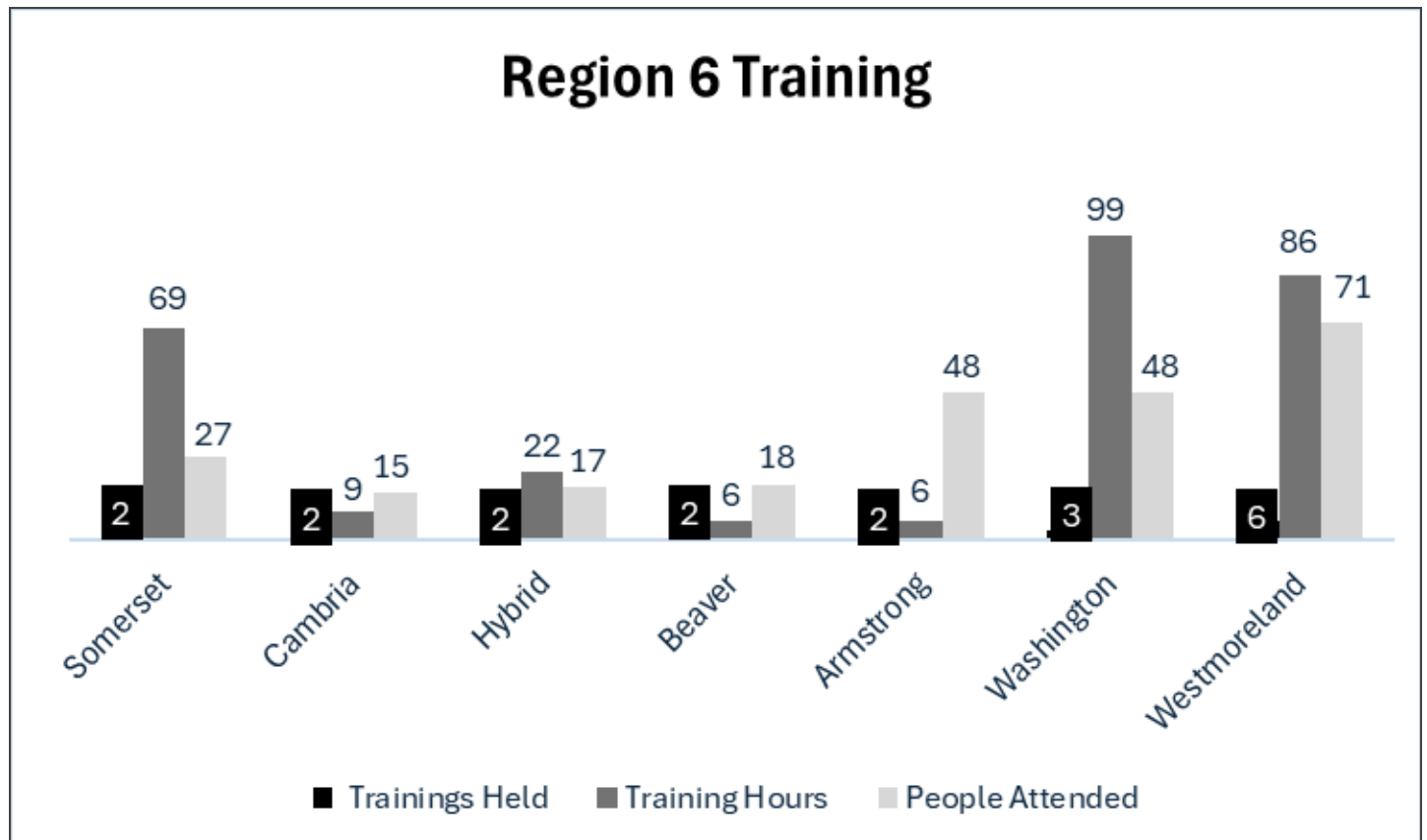
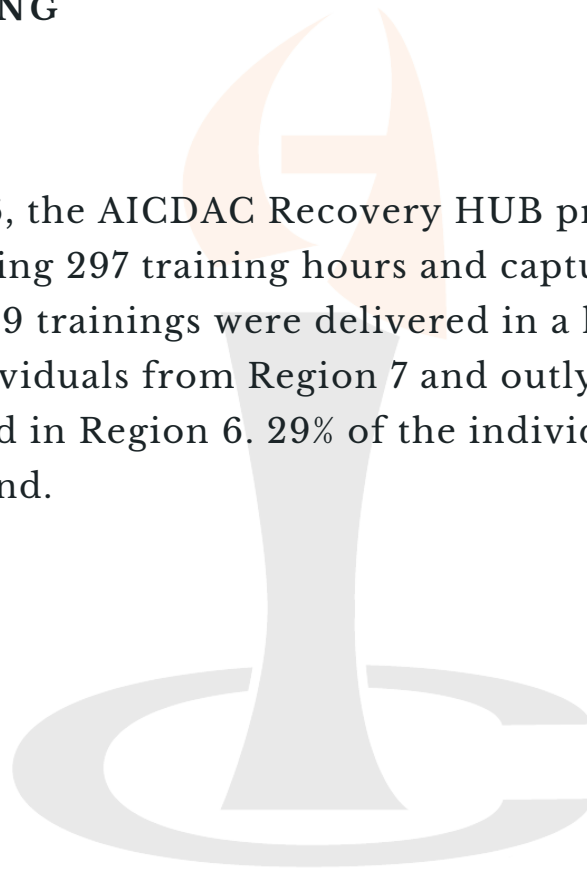


TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE OVERVIEW

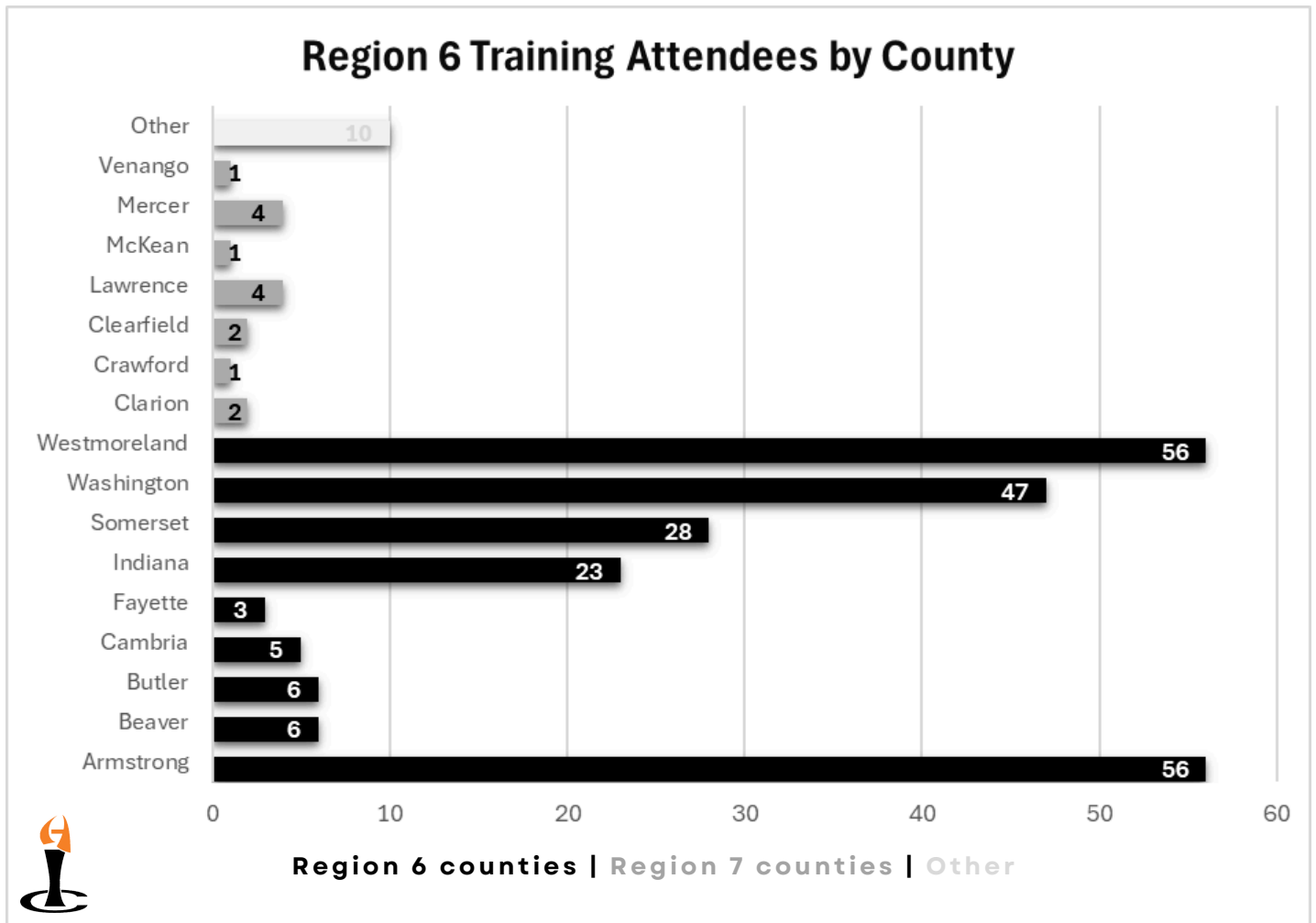
Between January, 2024 through December, 2024, the AICDAC Recovery HUB provided 84 counts of technical assistance to 19 counties falling into 12 categories.



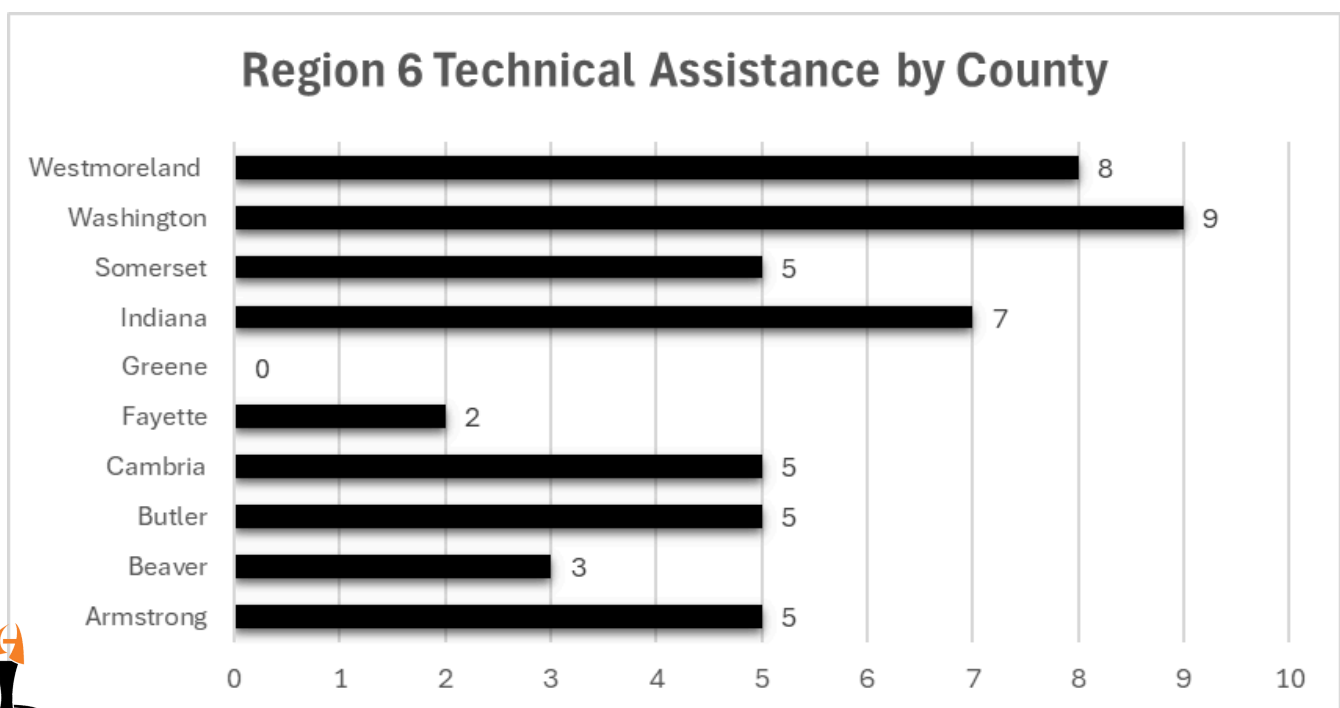
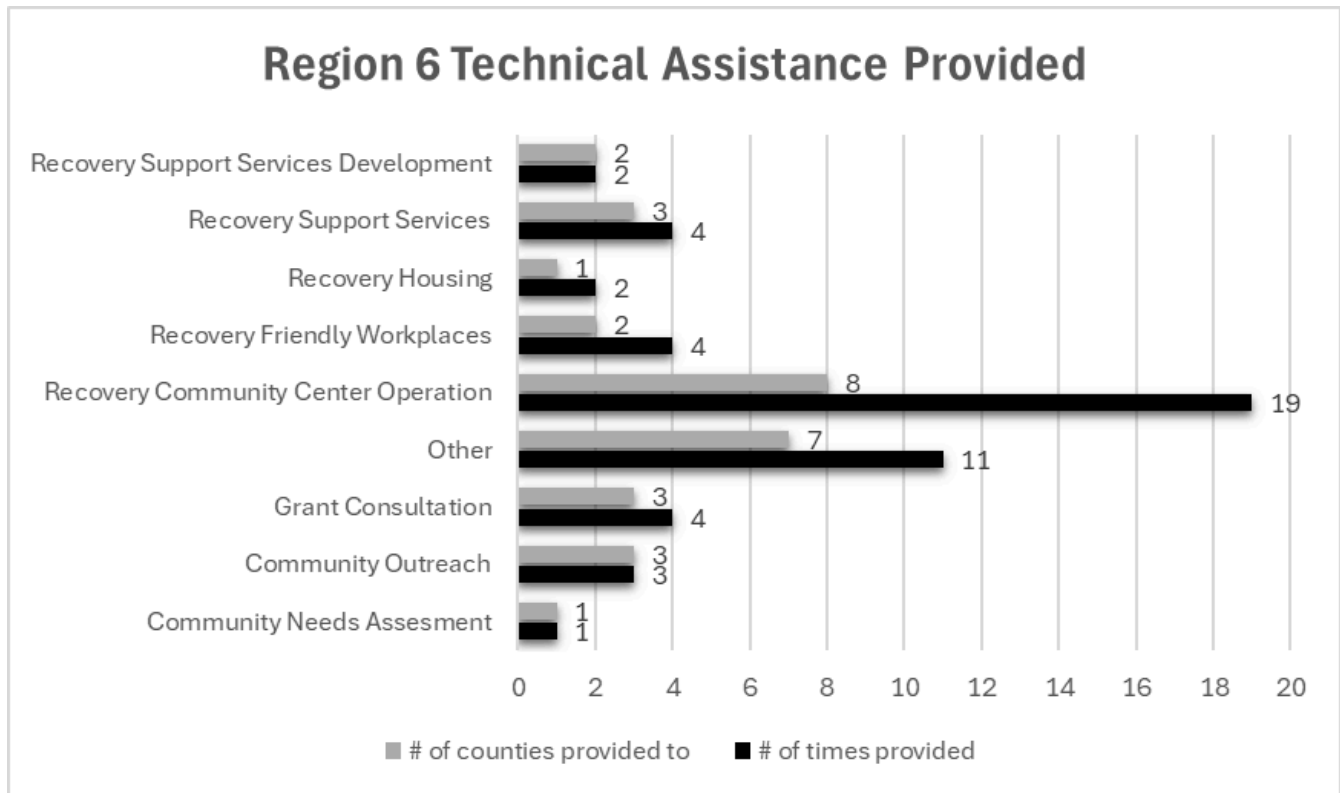
Throughout Region 6, the AICDAC Recovery HUB provided 19 trainings in 6 counties accumulating 297 training hours and captured attendance of 244 individuals. 2 of the 19 trainings were delivered in a hybrid (in-person and online) capacity. Individuals from Region 7 and outlying counties also attended training held in Region 6. 29% of the individuals registered for trainings did not attend.



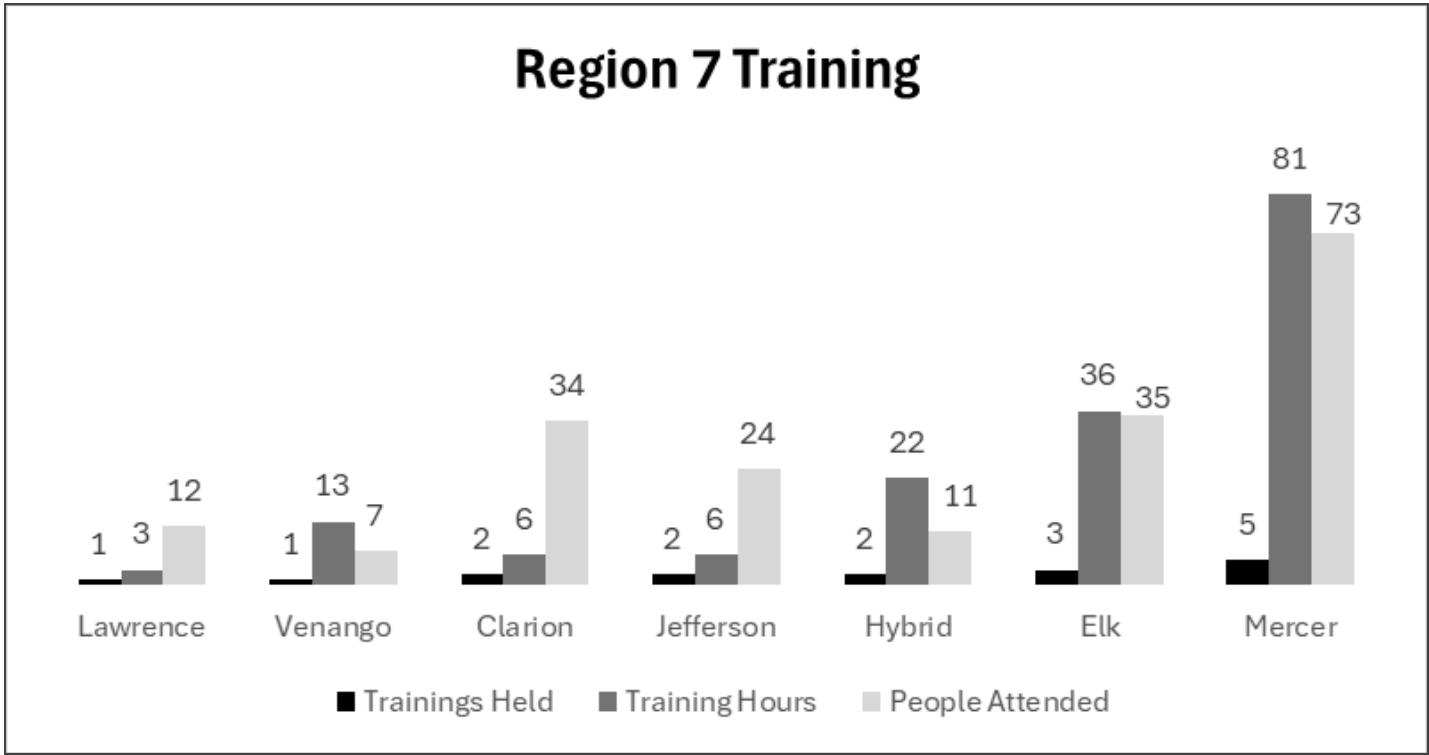
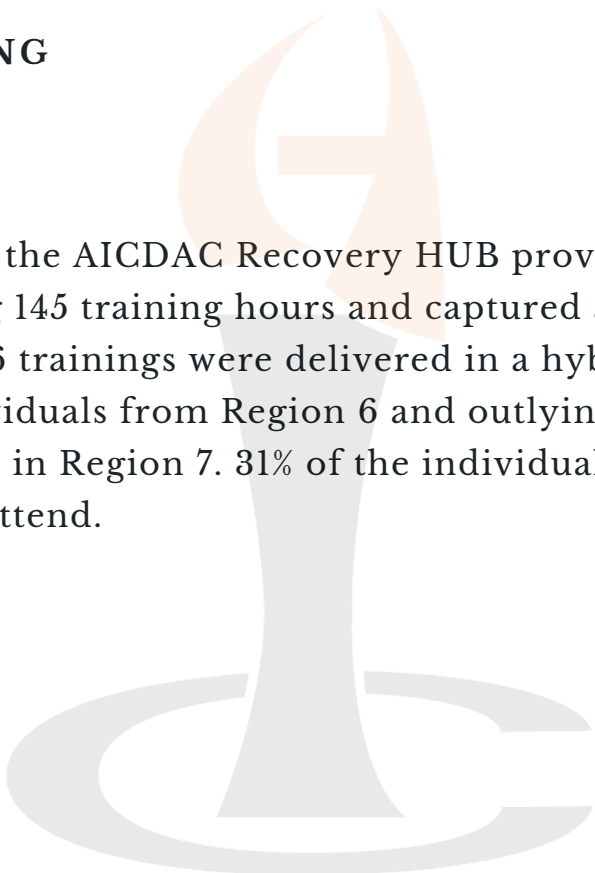

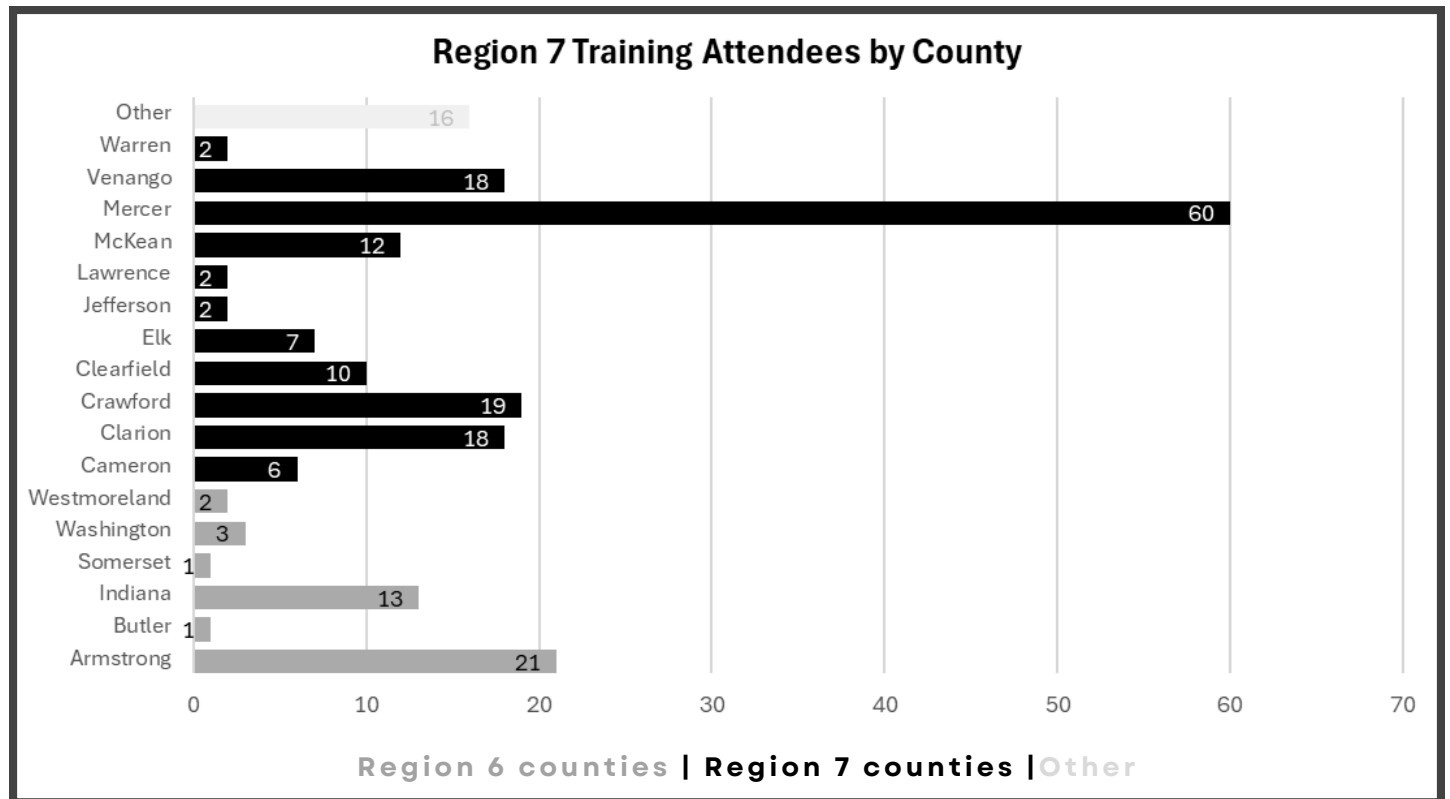
Throughout Region 6 , the AICDAC Recovery HUB provided 50 counts of Technical Assistance falling into 10 categories to varying organizations within 9 of the 10 counties. 1 of the 10 categories is labeled as “other” being a bucket of miscellaneous support such as visits to RCOs, redirection of training requests, and reporting outcomes.



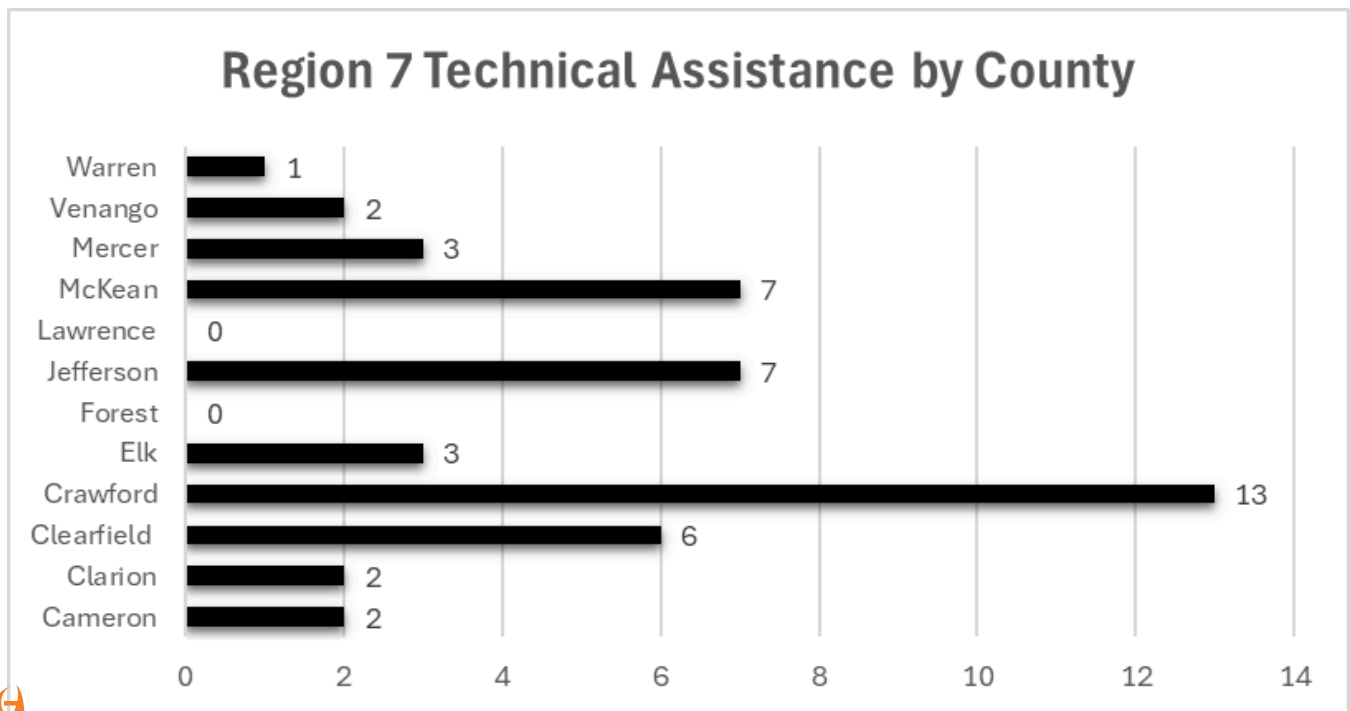
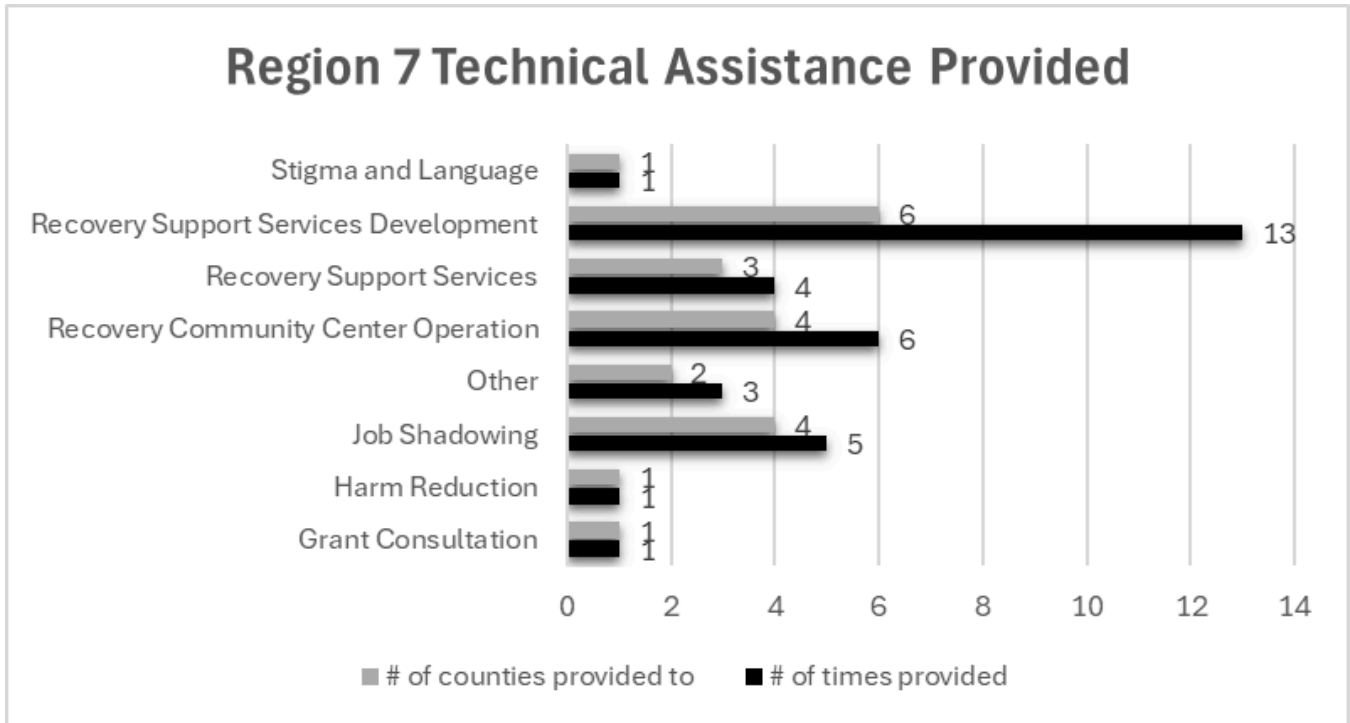
Throughout Region 7, the AICDAC Recovery HUB provided 16 trainings in 6 counties accumulating 145 training hours and captured attendance of 196 individuals. 2 of the 16 trainings were delivered in a hybrid (in-person and online) capacity. Individuals from Region 6 and outlying counties also attended training held in Region 7. 31% of the individuals who registered for the trainings did not attend.

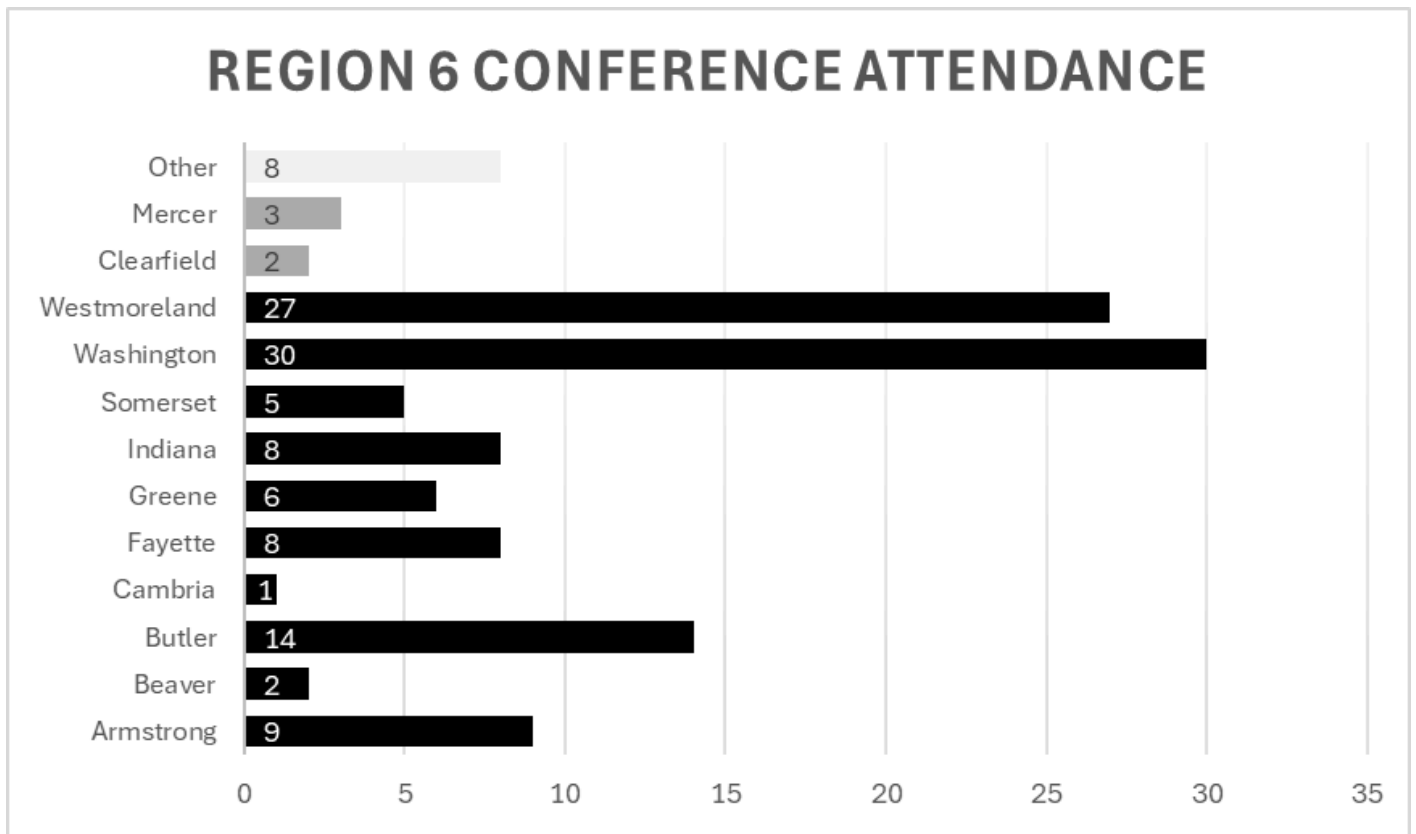

REGION 6 RECOVERY CONFERENCE - MAY 31, 2024

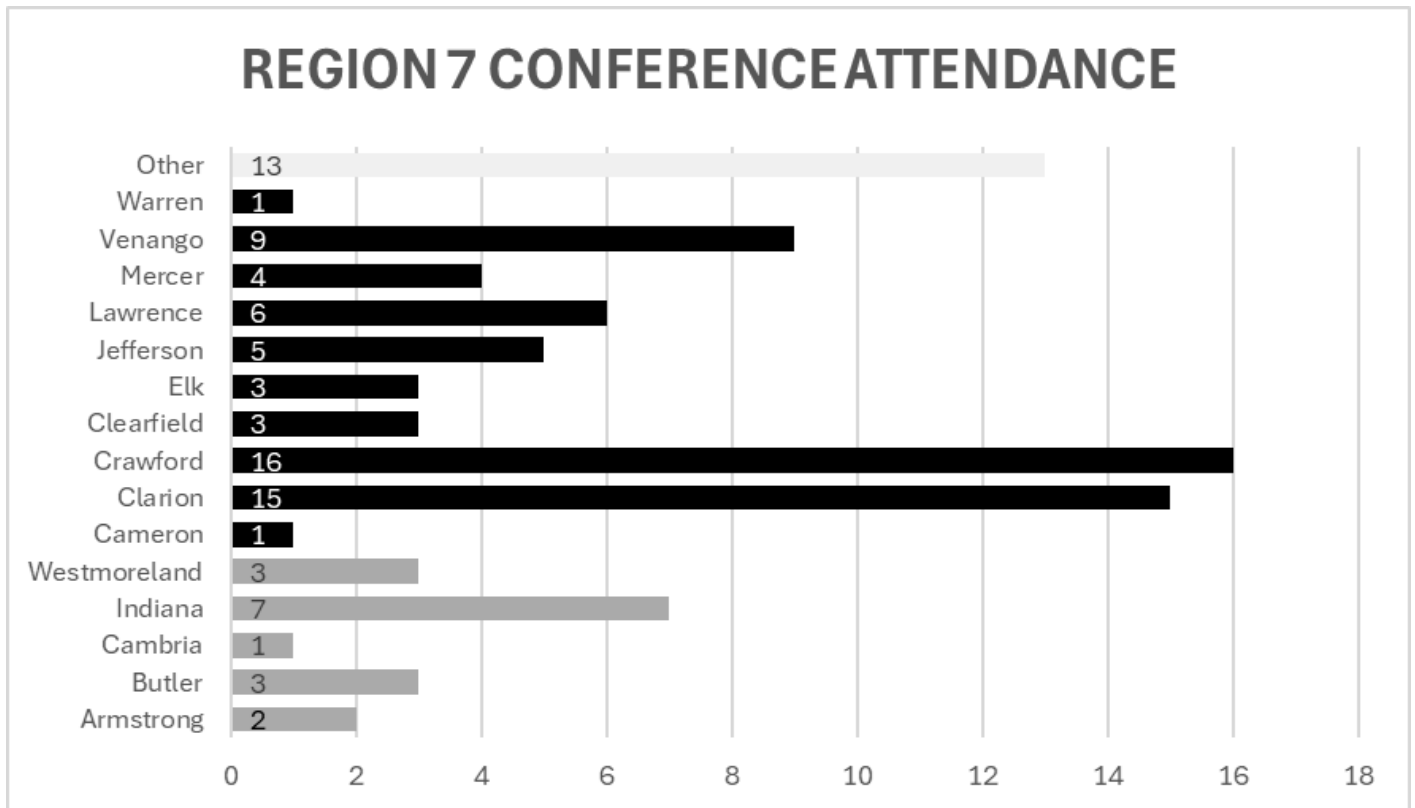

RECOVERY MONTH CELEBRATIONS

The Recovery HUB supported and attended three events in September, 2024. In addition, the Recovery HUB worked with organizations in Region 6 and Region 7 to sponsor transportation to and from the events.

Pittsburgh Recovery Walk - September 7, 2024 - Pittsburgh

The Recovery HUB Sponsored a table for the event and supported transportation for organizations in five counties; four counties in Region 6 and one county in Region 7.

Recovery Advocacy Day - September 24, 2024 - Harrisburg

The Recovery HUB Sponsored a table for the event and supported transportation for organizations in four counties; three counties in Region 6 and one county in Region 7. AICDAC Recovery HUB also hosted online TA to prepare individuals for speaking with Legislators and their Staff.

Rock for Recovery Music Festival - September 28, 2024 - Monongahela

The Recovery HUB Sponsored the hosting organization and a table at the event and supported transportation for organizations in five counties; three counties in Region 6 and two counties in Region 7.

LICENSED RECOVERY HOUSES

The number of Licensed Recovery Houses has increased in Region 6 and Region 7 over the last year. There are houses pursuing licensure and identified interested parties in both Regions currently. The Recovery HUB plans to work with these houses and interested individuals to provide Training, Technical Assistance and linkages that will continue to increase the number of licensed recovery houses in Region 6 and 7.

RECOVERY COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS AND RECOVERY CENTERS

The Recovery HUB is engaging with several RCOs' and RCCs throughout Regions 6 and 7. The HUB has provided Training and Technical Assistance to several organizations, sharing best practices, policies, procedures and ongoing support to RCOs and RCCs. There have been new organizations formed in Region 6 and emerging organizations in Region 7. RCOs and RCCs have engaged with training opportunities to support their programming and engaged with the monthly RCO Learning Collaborative meetings.

RECOVERY FRIENDLY EMPLOYMENT

There are Recovery Friendly Employment programs in both Region 6 and Region 7. AICDAC Recovery HUB has engaged with those agencies to support their initiatives and to learn about best practices to share with others. The Recovery HUB will be putting out a survey throughout both Regions to identify employers that hire individuals in recovery and plans to connect with those employers to offer support.

RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICE WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

AICDAC Recovery HUB has been very active in both Regions with regard to RSS Workforce Development through Training and Technical Assistance that support emerging and existing RSS programs. The RSS workforce has been engaged with training opportunities to support their growth and skill sets and have engaged with the monthly CRS/CFRS Learning Collaborative meetings. The HUB added an employment section to the bimonthly Newsletter to help connect individuals and hiring RSS organizations. The HUB will be releasing two surveys in the upcoming weeks. One survey will be for individuals who are or interested in providing RSS and the other survey will be for organizations that employ RSS staff.

TRANSPORTATION

The Recovery HUB is identifying and learning about existing transportation programs throughout Regions 6 and 7 as well as subject matter experts in other parts of the country. There are several organizations in each Region that are providing transportation to the people they serve.

REGIONAL RECOVERY CONFERENCES

AICDAC Recovery HUB is planning another round of Regional Recovery Conferences in 2025. Save the dates on May 21st, and June 18th. More information to come.
