We have been blessed to have a person of such high integrity and great musical talents serve our congregation for the past 25 years. Vince is not just an organist, pianist or a musician – he is a “Minister” of music and he takes his responsibility to provide meaningful worship music of all types and varieties very seriously.

In addition to his regular Sunday musical activities, Vince provides direction and leadership to our choir with weekly practices, meets with young students and adults to have them actively engage and provide their musical talents for our worship, and is an active ambassador for Advent to outside groups and individuals that bring their talents to Advent.

- Established a working relationship with the Gospel Choir of Wittenburg, Germany (The choir has sung at Advent)
- Established a working relationship with Castle Church in Wittenburg – has played there and other locations in Germany.
- Assistant Organist Project – opportunity for youth to learn more about the pipe organ
- Numerous musical compositions

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Happy New Year.

As we head into a new year, I am reflecting on this time last year. We were getting to the end of 2020, and I was so ready to close the book on that year. A year of partisanship, and division, and accusation, and animosity; a year when COVID hit, and there were hundreds of thousands of illnesses and deaths; and all of the masks and isolation and arguments about that, and the restrictions and distancing. It was just a tough year. I remember being so happy for a new year when hopefully we could put that behind us and get back to some sort of normal. LOL

And now, at the end of 2021, I'm looking forward to a new year again. The last year sort of felt like a repeat of 2020. Yes, we got together more, yes, there were some improvements, and yet so much felt the same. Nothing felt normal.

I'm not exactly sure what "normal" is going to look like. But I do know some things that we've learned. And some things I am grateful for.

I'm grateful that when we were doing the job interviews for our new administrator, Katie Rosenberg, I was able to be part of that even though I was on vacation in the upper peninsula of Michigan. Yes it was technology that we had before, but it would have been unusual a few years ago and now it was normal. This is what we do.

I am grateful for the technology and experience that allowed me to help out a gathering of now-grown-up missionary kids from Papua New Guinea. We gather every few years to support and encourage each other. It is emotional and life-giving. When we had that gathering in Minnesota this fall, it was a smaller gathering because of COVID and restrictions on traveling. But I was able to lead Zoom sessions where the in-person people connected up with people Zooming from Australia and Germany and Canada and other parts of the United States. We would not have even thought of doing that in the past.

I am grateful that I was able to be volunteering at the Salford Mennonite/Advent Lutheran community garden even as I was participating in an ordination service in King of Prussia. I was literally there in the garden picking beans and listening to and singing along with (and praying with) a worship service that was happening live at Good Shepherd Lutheran 20 miles away, where a colleague was becoming a new pastor. I never could have done that before.

I am grateful that we were able to worship in person again with our sisters and brothers in Christ at Salford Mennonite church for Thanksgiving eve. And grateful that the two presenters from Advent were incredible in sharing about the hurts and difficulties that they had gone through, and how God worked in that to move them to caring service for the sake of others. I am grateful for the inspiration and witness that they gave.

I am not sure what 2022 is going to hold. I sure do not know what “normal” is going to look like. But there are a couple things that come to mind - ideas or goals for the future.

One has to do with values and priorities. I remember how so many people early on in the pandemic talked about the gift of simplicity and of spending time with family, and wanted to remember and keep some of that. Then, as things sort of started to open up, all of that seem to go out of the window. It reminds me...that we need to take time...to just reflect on our experiences...what we've learned...where we've experienced God...and how we can keep some of those priorities and values and commitments in play as we go into the future. Intentional reflection and learning.

I think about our worship service. It is wonderful having people back in person, and that real personal presence does make a difference. I hope more people consider that. At the same time, our hybrid/online worship welcomes so many more. I know full well there are some who are uncomfortable coming here in person for different reasons. There are people who may be on vacation or may have disabilities. There are people who are not local, but with our online service are able to worship with us from Philadelphia and Chicago and South Australia. Really! All of those places and more. It's a great way for new people to check us out before they come into the community. So I think it's so important to find ways to strengthen that online worship. We want to reach out online and invite people to move from there to coming in-person. At the same time, we need to be intentional about building and caring for community (church) even with those who are not going to connect up regularly in person.

And I think that as we look into the future, we are a little more comfortable not having it all figured out. Not knowing exactly what's going to happen...next year...next month...even next week. Being able to be flexible and adapt and pivot and all those words that you've gotten tired of but are real skills that we've learned.

As we go into 2022, I don't know exactly what the future holds, but I know who holds the future. And there's a prayer I want to close with that is absolutely wonderful. It's in our hymnal and it's something that I like going back to over and over again. So, pray with me.

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Happy Birthday to **Mae Grafton** who is turning 103 on January 18th!

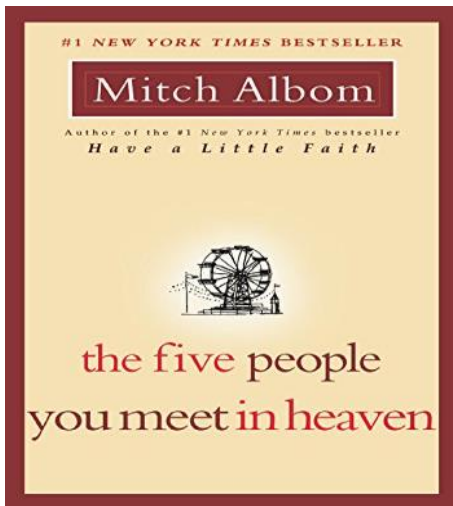
Birthday Card Ministry

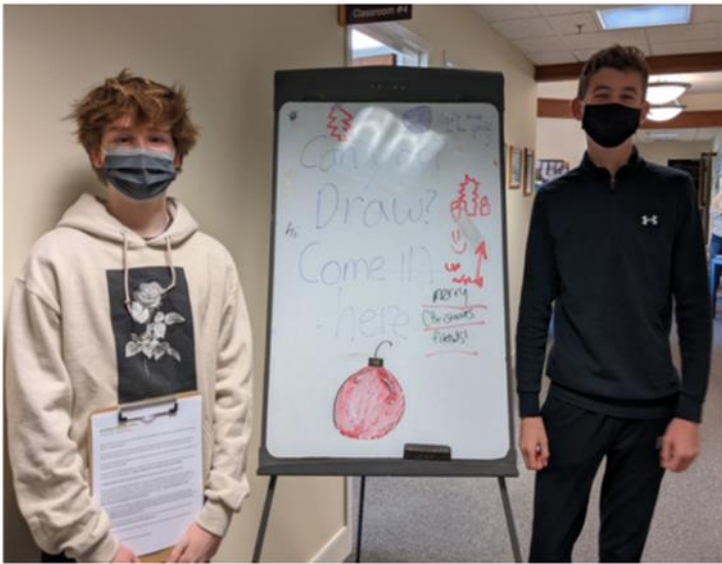

2021 Salford Mennonite-Advent Lutheran Church Garden Highlights

2021 was another great year at the Salford Mennonite-Advent Lutheran Church garden. The 3-quarters of an acre church garden increases access to fresh produce to those in our community that need it most, while strengthening social connections between our congregations. Advent has worked with Salford for over 10 years now.

We planted, cultivated, and harvested 15,495 pounds of produce this year! Below are the numbers for some of the produce that was picked this year.

1,047 lbs of beans, 703 lbs of potatoes, 5,629 lbs of tomatoes, 997 lbs of zucchinis, 913 lbs of onions, 1,984 lbs of green peppers, and 1,835 lbs of cabbage, which is a new garden record. We had some heads of cabbage that were 15 lbs a piece!

Here are a few of the organizations we donated produce to this year:

- Keystone Opportunity Food Pantry serving over 250 qualified households per month from the Souderton Area School District.
- Shepherds Shelf serving approximately 60 households per month from the Souderton Area School District, as well as Kulpsville, Lansdale and Towamencin.

- Encore Experience Harleysville.
- The Park View Community where our own Diana Shearer delivered produce to the residence, maintaining proper Covid protocols.

On November 6, 2021, Salford-Advent garden Leader Steve Blank, and faithful volunteer Nancy Alderfer, were recognized through a proclamation from the Pennsylvania State Senate for all their years of hard work and dedication at the garden, and for the impact the garden has had in the community.



One thing is certain, nobody can prepare, plant, cultivate and harvest this much produce alone. Please consider stopping by the garden in 2022 or talk with Sharon/Gary Strayer or Jo/Stam Wilhelmson if you have any questions about this ministry. There is something for everyone at the garden. No actual gardening or farming skills are required! We will gladly train you!

Starting in January, our congregation will be putting love into action by asking Advent members to make peanut butter and jelly sandwiches for the **Bread Drop** food program. This local outreach service, partnering with churches and other organizations, serves hungry people in Philadelphia and urban neighborhoods who are experiencing homelessness and food insecurity. If you would like to participate in this ministry, a sign-up genius will be created to volunteer for a slot. Sandwiches will be delivered weekly to Grace Lutheran in Hatfield each Tuesday.
