# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MARK



## HAPPY LENT?

### Remember, you are mortal!

Dear siblings in Christ,

*“Sack cloth and ashes, and days without eating,  
Mortification, and wailing and weeping...”*

So starts a playful song exaggerating the disciplines of Lent.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, this year on February 18. It is a season that moves toward Good Friday (cross), and a season that early on involved the preparation and teaching of new converts to Christianity (discipleship).

What does Lent mean for you?

For some, it might be a time of giving something up or adding a practice. For others, there might be a reaction against the penitence and religiosity of how you had experienced Lent in the past; perhaps you seek to reframe it by adding something instead of giving something up, or maybe just figuratively tossing Lent aside. And for some of you there might not be any real history...but maybe some curiosity?

Lent is my favorite season of the church year. It is not my favorite because I somehow “enjoy” the experiences or disciplines of Lent. It is my favorite because I believe I need it. It is an interruption. It challenges me to be intentional. I find that I reflect more, and do more, and grow more, in this season.

I don’t know about you, but I find it is so easy to find myself racing and reacting, getting things done from a list that never gets smaller.

Worthwhile things. Worship and people and programs and... and I move from one thing to the next.

Then Lent comes in and wacks me over the head with those startling words, “Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return.” (Remember you are mortal. Remember, you have an ending.)

I am not saying that those words are somehow good news. But when I pay attention, they are hopeful words. They are hopeful words like the doctor saying to the diabetic patient, *“You need to lose 20 pounds or this diabetes is going to become dangerous. Here’s what I’m prescribing.”* Or hopeful words like the cardiologist saying, *“If you don’t ease up on the salt, I’ll be seeing you right back here next year for another surgery.”* Hopeful, because they name the condition and challenge me to respond.

Now let me be clear. I don’t save myself. I don’t do things to earn God’s favor and ensure my blessing. But there’s something about those words of mortality, and the disciplines of Lent, that open me up to God in a special way.

That’s the thing about disciplines. They’re not necessarily pleasant. But they’re intentional, and they make a difference. They take me out of that day-after-day reacting and get me to pause, to reflect, to focus, to open myself to God, and to love my neighbor.

There’s nothing magic or mandatory about disciplines. I’ll share what works for me and you can decide what you want to try... if anything.

## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MARK CONTINUED

The traditional disciplines of Lent - actually named in the Ash Wednesday liturgy - are Fasting and Prayer and Almsgiving.

I know people who weekly give up a meal or skip a treat and use that money to give alms – to care for those in need – combining fasting, and almsgiving. I know people who say they'd rather add something than give something up. (I know less of them that actually DO that.)

I've tended to give up something, not because it's some healthy New Year's resolution, but because I'm giving up something I like and I will notice it...and channel it. As a coffee lover, I limit myself to 2 cups, only allowing myself to drink them when I am in prayer, Bible study, or spiritual reading. (It's amazing how much more diligent I am about that spiritual focus in Lent as a result.) Last year I added another element, doing without a couple meals each week. I started it as a spur of the moment decision, but it became a pretty helpful discipline. I got pretty hungry. I mostly channel that into reflections on what Jesus has done for me, and prayer time. It became a Lenten interruption. Not business as usual. Feeling different and trying to think differently. And it was effective most of the time. (Hey, nothing is perfect.)

The discipline of prayer happened through more personal Bible study and reflection, leading to the Bible studies I led each week on Wednesday mornings and late afternoons, and culminating in a special holy week podcast. I experienced worship and prayer with Advent for our mid-week

evening prayer service. And I tried to be intentional about more moments and times of prayer (bribed by coffee, but being blessed by spending prayer time with God).

Almsgiving is the discipline that I want to work on this more time. There were a few ways that I did extra things to help people in need. This year I'm hoping to make that more intentional with advocacy, service, and other "acts of mercy." We are in a time where people need that more and more.

Disciplines don't make you a Christian. And disciplines certainly don't make God love you more. But I have found that the Lenten interruptions and intentional actions open me up in a deeper way. It's not that God is more present, I just become more aware. And I think God messes with that in a good way.





How are you approaching Lent? Lent is traditionally seen as a season of penitence, of acknowledging our need and openness to God's forgiveness. It is a time of spiritual learning and growth (discipleship). And it is a time of focus on Christ and the cross.

Join us for this penitential season, of cross and discipleship, and maybe of interruption and disciplines. However you observe Lent, join us as we journey toward the heart of our Christian faith, Good Friday and Easter, God's gift of love through the cross, and God's forgiveness and new life in the resurrection.

Join us on that Lenten journey.

For many, this is a time of fear, worry, dread, helplessness and hopelessness. And so we gather, in a way that centers us, and opens us to God's presence. We need that.






## Bringing Christmas Cheer to Advent Lutheran Homebound Members

On **Monday** and **Wednesday evenings**, and **Tuesday mornings** volunteers (age 12+) are needed to distribute food items to those in need.


