We pray that Pastor Mark returns refreshed in body, renewed in spirit, and inspired for the ministry God continues to call him to lead here at Advent Lutheran Church.

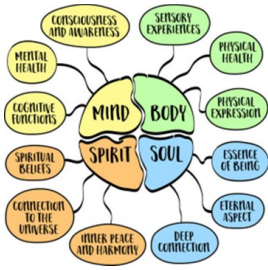

A PILLAR OF ADVENT

Has anyone ever wondered how Advent got its name? Well, for that we can thank my grandmother, Arlene Oelschlager Landis! Arlene (or Nana, as I called her) was a member of the building committee that was formed from members of the Lutheran Church at Old Goschenhoppen in the late 1980s. After over two

centuries of sharing a space with the Reformed congregation, the Lutherans were ready to take the leap of faith to build their own church. With the help of the building committee, and in large part to Dean Shollenberger, the Lutherans purchased the plot of land where Advent now stands. I always loved that Advent ended up being on Landis Road, something I'm sure my grandmother got a kick out of too! As the building committee was trying to decide on a name for the new church, my grandmother suggested Advent. Advent is a season of anticipation and hope. It is also one of new beginnings as it is the first season in the church year. The Lutherans certainly had been anticipating and hoping for their dream to come to fruition and having a name to put to their church I'm sure made it feel even more real.

Moving to Advent on Landis Road was certainly a new beginning for my grandmother as well, since she had been a lifelong member at Old Goschenhoppen. Arlene was born in 1931 to Katie and Ephraim Oelschlager. Her father was the sexton of the church so they lived in the house right next door. My grandmother, along with her brother LeRoy, were active members in the church from childhood up until the Lutherans moved to Advent in 1990. Arlene and LeRoy helped to carry on the tradition of Oelschagers at Old Goschenhoppen, with their ancestors dating back to the mid 1800s. My grandmother married my grandfather, Lloyd Landis, in 1950. I was surprised to learn that after they got married, my grandparents went back and forth between attending the Reformed service and the Lutheran service. Eventually, my grandmother decided it was time to pick one congregation and they committed to being full time Lutherans! They had five children who were all active in the church growing up, one of them being my mom, Joan Brown.

At Old Goschenhoppen and Advent, my grandmother served many roles including: choir member, member of council, council president, Sunday School teacher and Sunday School Superintendent. She also served as president of WELCA (Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America). She even organized a WELCA gathering where the ladies canoed down the Perkiomen Creek! My grandmother loved bringing people together and did so by helping to plan events including the Oyster Picnic, Strawberry Festival and women's retreats. She helped to design Advent's kitchen and for years some referred to it as "Arlene's Kitchen". On a Sunday morning, she could often be found there helping during coffee hour or one of Advent's many potlucks.

I've had a few members of Advent tell me that it was my grandmother that helped make them feel at home at Advent, being the first one to greet them when they came to their first service. She frequently invited church members from Old Goschenhoppen and Advent to her home for dinner. My fondest childhood memories are at my grandparents house on Salford Street, and I love that she opened up her home to so many church members too. As a hairdresser, she even served as the barber to many former Pastors!

As my grandmother's health deteriorated over the years due to her pulmonary fibrosis, she continued to remain active at Advent as much as she could. She was a Thursday Folder and an original member of the Busy Hands group. When she died in 2009, we had an interim pastor, as Pastor Jo had retired and Pastor Steve had not yet been called to Advent. At my grandmother's funeral, the interim pastor, who barely knew my grandmother, said that he felt his main calling during his time at Advent was to officiate my grandmother's funeral. From his interviews with my family and members of the church, he could tell how important she was to Advent and its heritage.

My grandmother was a woman of faith, hospitality, humor and warmth. She was a female leader in the church, when that was not as common as it is today. She is a huge part of the reason why Advent has always felt like home and a family to me. Everyone knew my Nana and the important role that she and the Oelschlager and Landis families played in the dream that Advent was, and how they helped to shape it into the welcoming place that it is today. I hope one day to be an inspiration to someone like Arlene Landis was to me. And if I haven't given you enough reason to love her yet, she's the one who taught me how to make my famous pretzel salad!

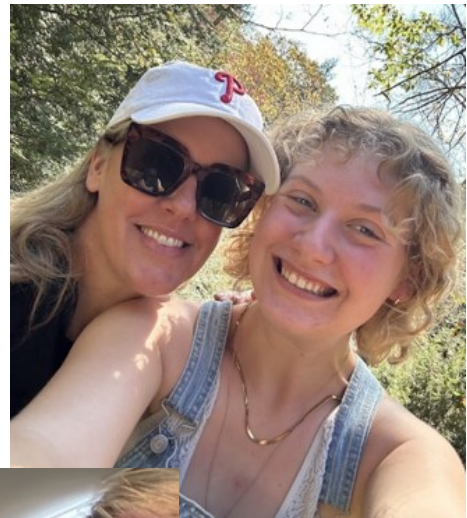

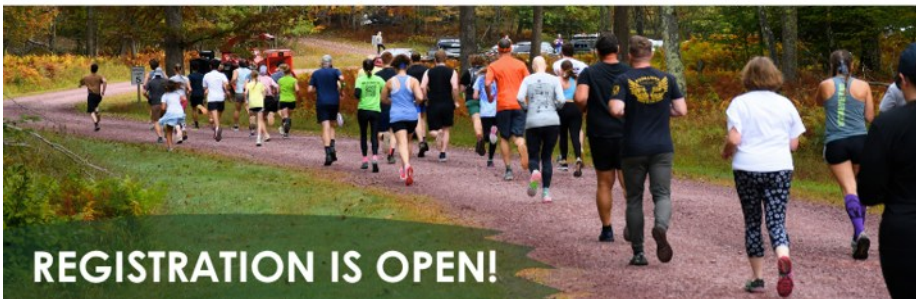
Labor Day Family Camp September 4–7

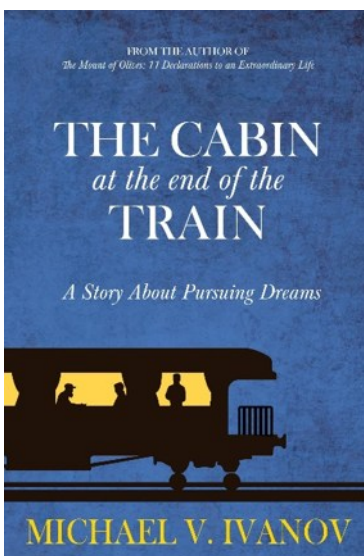


The Measure
