A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR MARK



NEW YEAR PERSPECTIVE

Looking back, and forwards

Dear siblings in Christ,

Have you ever been on a mountain hike? You wind around, following a stream, climbing a hill, maybe walking through some brush and an area of trees, then suddenly you reach a clearing. You are at a hilltop. Not the mountaintop –



there is more to climb. But from this clearing, you can look around. In front of you is a wonderful view, and perhaps a trail that winds further up the mountain. Behind you is the trail you just climbed. In one glance, you can look back see each of those twists and turns that was your whole, exhausting world earlier that day. You see the shady nook where you stopped for a breather, the thicket where you scratched your legs, the loose gravel section where you skidded and almost fell, and the steep spot where you started to wish you hadn't taken this trip. As you look back, the past is in view; as you face forward, you face your future, the path disappearing in the twists

and turns ahead of you.

It kind of feels like that at the end of a year.

We look back over the past year, and can see at a glance each of those moments that at the time were the whole world to us.



We look back at the delightful or joyful times – a get together with family or friends, a new birth, a job or graduation, some special moment in sports or music or adventure, or a vacation. We stare back at the times of sadness, hurt or loss – a death, an illness, loss of a job or a setback, conflicts or divisions. We turn our heads, and now we look forward – a new year – and we realize the path continues, twisting and turning out of sight ahead of us.

We are not the same people we were a year ago. It might be subtle, it might be life-changing, but we have been changed. And we step into the future.

Is there a word from God to help in this?

Let me share three simple messages.

1 – We are not alone; God is with us. In this Advent and Christmas season we hear the word, Emmanuel – “With-us God.” In the Great Commission Jesus promises, *“And lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age.”* But perhaps the most simple and comforting words are from the 23rd Psalm. *“Though I walk through the darkest valley, YOU are with me.”* In the tough times, in the worst parts of that journey, we have the promise that God journeys with us, leading and caring for us. *“Your rod and your staff, they comfort me.”*

2 – We are not alone; we journey with each other. We are relational creatures – we need each other. (Saint Paul talked about us as the Body of Christ – *“When one members suffers, all suffer together with it; when one member is honored, all rejoice together with it.”*) There’s something special

about sharing joys and celebrations with others. It makes them sweeter. And there's something so vital about sharing the hurts and griefs, of having a shoulder to cry on or a consoling hug, of reaching out to offer help, or gather for prayer. *"Two are better than one..."*

3 – It's about the journey, not the destination.

In our personal lives, we can get caught up in some ultimate goal – getting a certain status, or home, or education, or success of our children, or... In our faith lives, perhaps the destination is heaven? I'm not saying don't plan, nor am I discounting heaven. But we're called to live. As disciples. Following the one who described his ministry in terms of healing and caring for those in need – *"the blind see, the lame walk, the poor have good news preached to them."* Following the one who survived as a refugee, who risked standing up for foreigners and outsiders, who took time for and valued the littlest and most insignificant people of the day. Focusing on destination can narrow our gaze, keeping our attention on those in our destination plans.

Focusing on journey can give us permission to look around, notice the needs, stop to help, and work together. And then, maybe, to journey together.

Look around. Let's journey together. Let's care for each other. And let's follow the Good Shepherd, trusting that this awesome God will be with us always.

Thank you for your generous response to the 2026 stewardship request. The generosity of our members through time committed, talents shared, and financial gifts given allows us as a faith community to:

God's Creation, Advent's Meadow

Our meadow sites are planted! One is east of the parking lot, and another is on the west end of the church. Each site is currently covered in straw. In this season of waiting, we can be looking over there after worship, even though we don't expect to see seedlings until April! Our goal is to support the intricate network between plants, insects and humans that powers a thriving planet. We hope to see pollinators and other creatures enjoying our meadow, as we carry out our role as stewards of creation.

Tell us how your (in your yard) meadow plantings are going! One envelope covers a 5 ft by 5 ft square. If you need more to cover your area, reach out to Calvin Ribelin; he has the extra seed. And if you would like help planting your meadow, or would like to help someone else plant a meadow this winter, reach out to Heather Dagenais.

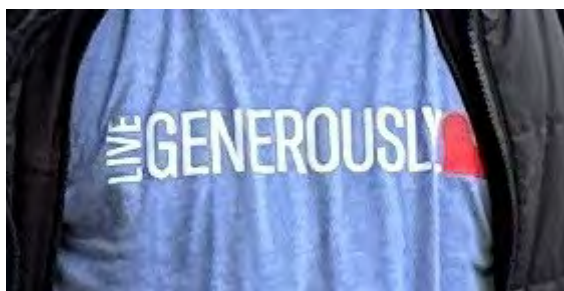

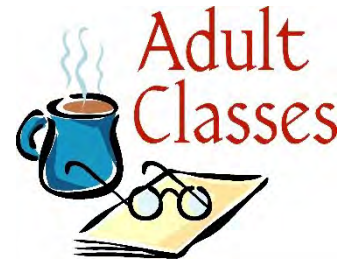


CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

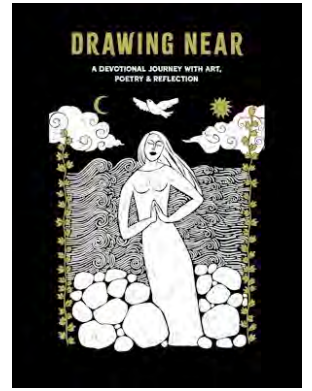
