When we are greeting visitors here at the corner of 12th and Guadalupe, and they seat themselves in our 400-seat sanctuary with only 20 other bodies, the impression they receive is not helped by an assurance that there are possibly another 20 or so of us worshipping via Facebook Live. While it is true that even if we all showed up our sanctuary would still be sparsely filled, but the difference between the presence of 20 bodies and that of 40 or 50 is real and palpable.

I know that the reasons that some might opt to worship from home are very real and compelling. But I ask you each to factor into your decision each and every Sunday morning another trend that Professional Studies and anecdotal conversations show. Churches are closing their doors at a higher rate than ever. We are rowing upstream, it seems, and now more than ever we need as many hands on the oars every possible time.

You know yourself how much you look forward to having others here to greet you and to join you in worship; please make every effort to give that same gift to your church family and the visitors that we so eagerly await.






Open Sanctuary


