



SEA POLLING & STRATEGIC DESIGN POLL MEMO: CLEAR PATH FOR TADDEO IN PRIMARY

Plurality of Voters Undecided in Democratic Primary Race for Governor

Despite two candidates with statewide platforms, only “Undecided” breaks 30 percent in a three-way field between Charlie Crist, Nikki Fried, and Annette Taddeo. **By any measure, the Democratic primary for Governor is wide open.**

While Taddeo starts at 13%, she is polling stronger than virtually every Democrat who ran in the 2018 Primary, including the eventual winner Andrew Gillum. Most notable is that Taddeo is easily within striking distance of the two other candidates who both, by conventional wisdom, claim a statewide presence.

Taddeo Jumps to Double-Digit Lead with Clear and Simple Message & Personal Story

After reading basic bio statements about the three candidates, Taddeo surges to a 22-point lead over Crist and leads Fried by 10 points. Taddeo had the most ground to make up so it's important to see this level of movement across a range of demographics. Taddeo picks up votes across the board – she leads among Hispanic voters, Black Voters and White Voters. Her lead is most pronounced among women, especially younger and working women, younger voters and Hispanic voters. She also does extremely well among the key urban media markets. She adds to her strong position in South Florida by doubling her vote in Miami. She does even better across the entire I-4 Corridor: tripling her vote in Orlando and quadrupling her support in Tampa wiping out the early home field advantage held by Crist. **So, why does Taddeo jump out to such a large lead?**

METHODOLOGY

The poll was conducted Thursday, April 15 through Tuesday, April 20, 2021 by live phone operators in English and Spanish. The survey has a 74% cell phone. Base sample=600, MOE +/- 4.0 with an oversample of 200 additional Democrats and 100 additional for totals of 438 and 237, respectively. The poll was modeled with 41% Republicans, 38% Democrats and 21% NPAs; 69% White, 14% Hispanic, 12% African-American/Black, 5% Other.
