How can I help my teen find a job?

- Must first find a job & get a letter of intent to employ from the employer

- Receive your work permit.

Standardized Testing

What is the PSAT 8/9?

A test that will help educators and students figure out what students need to work on most so that they are
ready for college when they graduate from high school. It tests the same skills and knowledge as the SAT,
PSAT/NMSQT, and PSAT 10 — in a way that makes sense for your grade level.
