First Reading Isaiah 52:7-10

In the early church, Sunday was known as the "day of light." And so it is special when Christmas falls on a Sunday, as it does in today. As light dawns on this morning, as children scramble to the tree to see what has appeared, we remember that the sacred comes in the form of surprise sometimes, just as it did when light and life came to us in a baby in a humble stable. Can we dare to believe that we can know a surprising calm, even in the midst of anxiety because of the in-breaking of this Prince of Peace upon our lives?

Hear this reading from the Prophet Isaiah, chapter 52
How beautiful upon the mountains
are the feet of the messenger who announces peace,
who brings good news, who announces salvation,
who says to Zion, "Your God reigns."

Listen! Your sentinels lift up their voices together they shout for joy, for in plain sight they see the return of the Lord to Zion.

Break forth; shout together for joy, you ruins of Jerusalem, for the God has comforted the people; God has redeemed Jerusalem.

The Eternal One has bared their holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church.

Second Reading John 1:1-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The Word was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through the Word, and without the Word, not one thing came into being. What has come into being was life, and that life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it.

There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. Christ, the Word, was in the world, and the world came into being through the Word, yet the world did not know or understand. Jesus came to what was his own, and but his own did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in Jesus' name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of humanity, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have beheld that glory, the glory as of a parent's only child, full of grace and truth.
