First Reading

A Selection from “Lent In Plain Sight”

Be unencumbered and ready to move. Do not be weighed down with baggage, literal or figurative, but be open to the hospitality of whoever offers you a meal, a room, a seat at their table, and a place in their home.

Shoes for mission must be sturdy, comfortable, and appropriate for all terrain. Sandals in Jesus' day and climate would have fit that bill. Sandals were easily removed. Dust shaken off. Feet readily washed. Repeat as necessary. Therefore, the wearer could enter and leave a town, a neighborhood, a home without delay, assistance or fanfare. If we too seek to serve, our shoes should reflect our willingness to go wherever Jesus sends us...

Second Reading

Luke 17:11-19

Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he was going into a village, ten people who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance and called out in a loud voice, “Jesus, have mercy on us!”

When he saw them, he said, “Go, show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went, they were cleansed.

One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan.

Jesus asked, “Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?” Then he said to him, “Rise and go; your faith has made you well.”
