First Reading

“From the outside, community can seem such a beautiful place of sharing, cooperation, mutual support and so on. But as soon as we are inside it, we quickly begin to see each other’s faults! At the beginning, we idealize others. Then, as we get close to them, we begin to see only what is negative. We have to pass through these stages in order finally to meet people as they really are, neither angels nor demons, but human beings, beautiful but wounded, a mixture of light and darkness. These are the people with whom we have made a commitment to live and grow together...

There is always the danger of picking and choosing. We enjoy being with certain people, who are charming, funny, and intelligent...but little by little the novelty wears off...when difficulties arise there are danger of wanting to simply drop that friend...

...We choose our friends, but, we do not choose our brothers and sisters, our siblings. In the same way, our companions in community are not of our choosing. This is where the difficulties of community life begins...some people attract us, some rub us the wrong way.

These difficulties can lead people to run away from community, to cut themselves off from those they find unsettling, to become introverted and refuse to communicate, to accuse and condemn others; or it can lead them to work on themselves to struggle against selfishness and their need to be at the center of everything so as to welcome, understand and serve others better. When this happens, community life can become a school of love and source of healing.”

Matthew 14:13-21

Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to Jesus and said, “This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves.” Jesus said to them, “They need not go away; you give them something to eat.” They replied, “We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish.” And Jesus said, “Bring them here to me.” Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. And those who ate were more than five thousand men, women and children.
