### First Reading

#### The Story of our Featured Hymn

Bill Gaither is an American singer and songwriter of southern gospel and Contemporary Christian music. Besides having written numerous popular Christian songs with his wife, Gloria, he is also known for performing as part of the Bill Gaither Trio, and the Gaither Vocal Band. In the 1990s, his career (as well as the careers of other southern gospel artists) gained a resurgence as the popularity of the Gaither Homecoming series grew.

Written by Bill Gaither himself, “You (He) Touched Me” helped propel Gaither onto the national stage. Gaither had been writing songs since 1960, but nothing struck the chord with the American public – but everything changed fifty-four songs later.

“I started writing in 1960 and had written a few that were strong songs, but nothing had made an impact on a national level yet,” Gaither said. “That all changed with ‘You (He) Touched Me.’”

The story behind the song started from an old preacher friend of Gaither named Dr. Dale Oldham, whom he recalled to be a “very eloquent speaker.” While accompanying Oldham on some evangelistic crusades, the old preacher one day mentioned to him:

“The word ‘touch’ is a very powerful word. It comes up so often in the New Testament stories about Jesus touching people’s eyes and healing them or touching people’s lives and changing them. It’s a special word, and you ought to write a song that praises His touch.”

After that conversation, Gaither drove back to his home in Anderson, Indiana, with Dr. Oldham and his son, Doug. The seed of the song’s idea further deepened when the three started talking about how deeply the Spirit of God was felt during the crusade meetings. When he finally dropped them off, Dr. Oldham told him once again, “You should write a song that says, ‘You (He) touched me’ oh, You (He) touched me.”

Gaither had a hard time sleeping that night, unable to shake off what the old preacher told him, so he did what he said – Gaither wrote, “You (He) Touched Me.”

In 1971 Elvis Presley recorded “You (He) Touched Me.” It was also the title track of his 1972 Grammy Award-winning album. “I finally got a copy of his record. I just stood there saying, ‘Hey, Elvis is singing my song! But that was all a bonus. I just really love the song,’ Gaither said.

The last verse and chorus we sing today was added especially for Pride, by Rev. Nancy.

### Gospel Reading

#### Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26

As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector’s booth. “Follow me,” he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him. Jesus turned and saw her. “Take heart, daughter,” he said, “your faith has healed you.” And the woman was healed at that moment.

When Jesus entered the synagogue leader’s house and saw the noisy crowd and people playing pipes, he said, “Go away. The girl is not dead but asleep.” But they laughed at him. After the crowd had been put outside, he went in and took the girl by the hand, and she got up. News of this spread through all that region.
