First Reading

Why would a church that is predominantly white, celebrate Black History Month?

Let's suggest a few reasons:

Because Black History is really American History Because Black History is often not lifted up as a valued, essential part of our history.

Because in our State, the teaching of the story of African
Americans as a legitimate subject of history is under attack
Because learning about one another is one way to open our hearts to
greater understanding, love and peace, something Jesus taught:
To love our neighbor as ourselves – all our neighbors.

Let's hear why some elementary school age children think Black History is important. Let the children teach us this morning.

Second Reading

Mark 1:40-45

A leper* came to Jesus begging him, and kneeling* he said to Jesus, 'If you choose, you can make me clean.' Moved with pity,* Jesus* stretched out his hand and touched him, and said to him, 'I do choose. Be made clean!' Immediately the leprosy* left him, and he was made clean. After sternly warning him he sent him away at once, saying to him, 'See that you say nothing to anyone; but go, show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing what Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.' But he went out and began to proclaim it freely, and to spread the word, so that Jesus* could no longer go into a town openly, but stayed out in the country; and people came to him from every quarter.
