The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly,
and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give
as you have made up your mind, not regretfully or under compulsion, for God
loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in
abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share
abundantly in every good work.

Second Reading II Corinthians 8: 8-15

I'm not trying to order you around against your will. But by bringing in the
Macedonians' enthusiasm as a stimulus to your love, I am hoping to bring the best
out of you. You are familiar with the generosity of Jesus Christ. Rich as he was, he
gave it all away for us—in one stroke he became poor and we became rich.

So here's what I think: The best thing you can do right now is to finish what you
started last year and not let those good intentions grow stale. Your heart's been in
the right place all along. You've got what it takes to finish it up, so go to it. Once
the commitment is clear, you do what you can, not what you can't. The heart
regulates the hands. This isn't so others can take it easy while you sweat it out.
No, you're shoulder to shoulder with them all the way, your surplus matching their
deficit, their surplus matching your deficit. In the end you come out even.
