

SHEPHERD'S CLUB NEEDS YOU

Our Shepherds Club is a dedicated group of Nobles and Ladies, who travel in teams of 2, a pilot and a co-pilot to transport our Shriners Hospitals for Children® patients and their parent to their appointments at one of the three hospitals that serve our region, Philadelphia, Boston and Springfield, Massachusetts... all at no charge to the patient or his or her family.

A ride starts when the Office receives a Transportation Request either by the family or the Hospital. Pertinent information is collected on the phone, then a document is computer-generated and then transmitted to Noble Gordon Fleming who acts as the Club Director, which with the help of the Office Manager, Ana Millan, coordinates the volunteer Shepherds who then make the final arrangements for the trip.

Trips generally are about 3-5 hours long, while some can be shorter, for perhaps just a drop-off or pick-up rather than waiting for the patients to finish their appointments before returning home.

While not the case in all Shrines, Salaam is fortunate to have its own fleet of two fully-equipped late model Chrysler Pacifica vans that can accommodate most standard and powered wheelchairs.

Once the Team arrives, the patient is taken to their appointment at the Clinic or with the various specialists, while the Shepherd drivers enjoy a complimentary hot meal in the Hospital Cafeteria, and usually catch an hour of shuteye in the recliners that are in the Driver's Lounge, watch TV or chat quietly with Nobles and Drivers from other Shrine locations who are waiting for their patients to finish.

If you are interested, have a good driving record and a willingness to interact and help transport our patients and their families, visit our monthly meetings at 9:30 am on the last Friday of each month. Drivers have to be certified each year to take trips and new drivers are paired with established "Super Drivers" until they are comfortable with the routes and the system. 

WANDER THE DESERT NO MORE WELCOME HOME NOBLES OF SALAAM

WHIPPANY, NJ. 2018

After almost two and a half years of "wandering in the desert" so to speak, Salaam Shriners can now "return" to our new home located at 114 Algonquin Parkway in Whippany, New Jersey which is about 5 miles west of our old Livingston site and just north of Route 10.

The single-story 13,500 square foot building is modern with the latest card access security, surveillance, entertainment and sound systems and features a movable system of soundproof divider walls with integrated doors that hang on tracks which can easily be manipulated to divide the space into as many as three separate rooms for various events. Another feature is the new commercial kitchen complete with ice makers and a commercial dishwasher to allow food to be prepared and served at various events and meetings.

In the new building, there are no Unit or Club rooms as we had in Livingston, but rather several multipurpose rooms are ideal for meetings and there's ample storage for each Unit and Club's supplies
and regalia. One thing that is different is the creation of a single central bar and not individual smaller
Unit room bars. The well-appointed and stocked bar has three taps, two for those beer drinkers and
another reserved with draft Birch Beer for non-drinkers. We learned from Livingston, there was less
socialization between the Units and less overall participation in Shrine activities when there was a
private "oasis" in the form of a Unit room bar to escape to. The central bar can easily accommodate
more than a hundred thirsty Nobles and promotes brotherhood and comradery.

A well-lit parking area while, not as vast as Livingston, easily holds over 80 vehicles and is on one level— totally handicap accessible. Other well-designed features include a Coat Room, a full Main Office area that has space for the Recorder, Treasurer, Office Manager and Shepherds Coordinator, plus a private office for the Potentate and a large Boardroom to hold Divan or other smaller meetings.

We held our first Stated Session there earlier this month. And as our Nobles explored the building, you could see the smiles of approval in what they way with a sense of accomplishment and personal pride in the thought put into the project and the quality of the work done.

Our move to Whippany also brings our Brothers from the Scottish Rite of Northern Valley here with us. They have their own offices in the back section of the building and plenty of storage space for their costumes and regalia.

Our new building is at the corner of Algonquin Parkway and Melanie Lane and is easily accessible from a variety of directions including Routes 80, 10, and 287. We also have the same phone number 973-992-1111 and while we changed our physical address, our web address continues as: www.salaamshrine.com.

At the time of this writing we had only received a temporary Certificate of Occupancy and are awaiting final inspection and a permanent CO by the end of the month.

Our original tenants that were part of the building when we took over, have since left, so there is an approximately 5,000 sq. ft. area which is divisible, and available for immediate occupancy.

At the February Stated Session, Illustrious Sir Joseph M. Hummel, our 2019 Potentate, heartily commended the Building and Grounds Committee for their dedication and hard work in securing and bringing the building to fruition. Those named included Illustrious Sir John Clyburn, PP, Illustrious Sir Richard Ash, PP, Noble Paul DiGaetano, our Assistant Rabban, Noble Richie Jackson, Noble John Festa, and Noble Harry Worstell.

Noble Gordon Fleming, as the head of the Committee, was especially recognized for his countless hours spent, expertise and personal involvement in the project as our "Chief Artificer" and the numerous hours spent on the phone or in-person with the architect and contractors to get the building ready. At the suggestion of Noble Charles Willer, a motion was made to award lifetime membership status to Noble Fleming for his outstanding leadership and construction knowledge which was instrumental in overcoming issues, completing the building and in finally working diligently behind the scenes to secure our CO. The motion was passed unanimously and Noble Fleming was very surprised, moved and humbled by the gesture and thanked the Nobility for placing their confidence in him.

While the building is not zoned to be a formal rental hall, we are making available the facilities for our Nobles and their immediate families as great venue for family gatherings, meetings and business functions. For more information contact the Salaam office at 973-992-1111 and leave a message.

Salaam Shriners By-Laws Amendments

Proposed by: Noble Frank M. Williams, Chief Rabban Presented February 11, 2019 Stated Session

AMENDMENT #1

Current:

§ 2.6 Change of Order. The order of meetings shall be changed for the December Stated Session, when the next order of business following the Ceremonies of Opening shall be the election of Officers and Representatives to Shriners International, after which the order of business may be resumed, or the Salaam Shriners closed. The Installation of Officers shall take place at the Annual Meeting in January.

Proposed:

§ 2.6 Change of Order. The order of meetings shall be changed for the December Stated Session. The December Stated Session shall commence no later than 7:00 P.M., and business shall be conducted from the start of the business meeting until 7:30 P.M. Promptly at 7:30 P.M., all business shall be suspended and the election of Officers and Representatives to Shriners International shall commence. Upon the completion of the election of officers and Representatives to Shriners International, the Potentate may close the stated session or proceed with any further business he may see appropriate to entertain.

Interpretative Statement:

The proposed amendment is of a two-fold purpose. First, the current section requires that regardless of what time a stated session in December commences, no business shall take place until after elections are completed. Therefore, if pertinent business or reports must be presented and/or acted upon, the nobility is prohibited to present any such business that must be conducted and the Potentate is prohibited from entertaining any such business until after elections are completed. The intention of this proposed amendment is to provide the nobility the opportunity to present business prior to the elections. Second, the last sentence in the current section requires that the installation of officers shall take place at the annual meeting in January. This sentence it is in conflict with § 13.2 as currently written; therefore, the same should be removed to avoid any discrepancy between the same.

Concurrent with this proposed amendment, an amendment to § 13.2 is likewise being proposed as to the requirement of when the Installation of Officer shall take place.

AMENDMENT #2

Current:

§ 13.2 Installation. The Installation of officers shall be held immediately following the annual meeting in January, in accordance with the Ceremony of Installation prescribed by Shriners International.

Proposed:

§ 13.2 Installation. The Installation of Officers shall be held at a date and time convenient to the temple no later than one (1) week following the Annual Meeting in January. The ritual for the ceremony of installation shall be in accordance with the then-current Ceremony of Installation prescribed by Shriners International.

Interpretative Statement:

Under past practice of this Temple, two installations occur annually; specifically, the "private" installation at the annual meeting, which only nobles in attendance at the annual meeting may attend, and the "public" installation, which is held at a date and time at the discretion of the Potentate-Elect and is a time for the public to be in attendance. In reality; however, the past several "private" installations occurred during the annual meeting (since the temple was not closed prior to the ceremony of installation); rather than following the annual meeting (which is what our by-laws require).

The proposed amendment still permits a Potentate-Elect, if he does not desire to hold a public installation, to still hold his installation immediately following the Annual Meeting in January. However, the removal of the requirement that the installation of officers takes place immediately following the annual meeting in January grants discretion to the Potentate-Elect as to the time and date as when his installation will occur within a within a reasonable period of time following the Annual Meeting in January.

Concurrent with this proposed amendment, an amendment to § 2.6 is likewise being proposed as to the change in order of business of the December Stated Session and the removal of the requirement that the installation of officers shall occur immediately following the Annual Meeting in January, which is currently in conflict with this section. The adoption of this proposed amendment, together with the adoption of the proposed amendment to § 2.6 would remove the conflicting language.

Spinal correction Halo Gravity traction Gravity lends a hand

If you have spent any time around the Shriners Hospital for Children®—Philadelphia over the past few years, you may have noticed some of our patients "hanging around." Not in the sense of a typical teenager. Literally — "hanging" from a rope. One of the primary conditions that our hospital provides care for is scoliosis, a curvature of the spine. We have a variety of treatment options from non-surgical to surgical to improve scoliosis. All of these treatments options are tailored to each specific child. Sometimes the curvature can be so severe that a multi-stage procedure is recommended.

Halo traction

Children with severe scoliosis can benefit from halo traction. This treatment allows us to slowly stretch out a severe curve gradually over time, which can help make the final surgery safer. We also use this time in traction to help optimize the child from a nutritional and a respiratory standpoint in an effort to get them in the best shape possible for their surgery, which can gradually and safely correct the curvature over time. The halo is a carbon fiber ring that is carefully placed on the child's head in our operating room when they are completely sedated. Once the child has fully recovered, we begin



with only a small amount of weight to help the kids adjust to life with a halo and begin their journey. Halo traction can last for several weeks. Halo gravity traction makes their care safer because it is a slow gradual correction and their bodies and nerves can adjust to these changes.

Being in this state does

not mean losing their freedom; our patients have special walkers with the pulleys attached and their beds also have the weights and pulleys. Patients who use wheelchairs for mobility can have it specially attached to their wheelchairs.



There are several variations on how and when we utilize halo traction. Often we will leave patients in halo gravity traction for about four to six weeks before their spine surgery. Sometimes we split the surgery up into two or more days and utilize halo-gravity traction over the time in between surgeries. During the first surgery, we often loosen up the spine so that the traction may have greater effect afterward. During the fusion surgery, we keep the patients under traction to maintain the correction they gained over the previous weeks. At the end of this surgery, we remove the ring.

Team effort

It takes a team effort to give these kids the best care. The surgeons put the ring on and do the surgeries but they couldn't do those things without the operating staff and the anesthesia team. The physical therapy department is in charge of setting up the pulleys and weights. They also have the tough job of trying to keep the kids from losing too much of their muscles while they are not bearing weight normally. To do this the patients undergo intensive therapy sessions out of their traction daily. The inpatient nursing staff cares for the patients while they are in traction. The nurse practitioners, nutritionists, and respiratory care staff play key roles. The extended time in the hospital inevitably leads to the development of special bonds between the staff and these unique patients and their families. By the time, these patients are ready to leave the hospital they are changed by having their curvy spines straightened but we are too by having had the privilege of being such a big part of their lives for a few weeks.
