# **Our Philosophy**

## **Stupendous Staff**

Camp Wonder understands the importance of positive role models for today's youth. When people ask what makes Camp Wonder different from other camps, we say with pride that it's our people. Each summer, over 60 enthusiastic and caring staff come to the Nature Center to shape and impact campers' lives.

All staff members undergo background checks and a stringent training program. We stand dedicated to providing a safe and fun experience for your child. Camp leaders are Red Cross First Aid and CPR certified, and all aquatic and adventure-based programs are operated by qualified, certified, and caring staff. In addition, our camp is licensed by the State of Michigan and accredited by the American Camp Association.

We maintain a 1:10 camper-to-staff ratio across all of our groups and are not able to accommodate 1:1 support requests at this time. If your child has a paraprofessional at school or requires a 1:1 ratio, we are more than happy to help connect you with a camp that provides that level of support and is the right fit for your family.

#### **HEAL**

Our camps provide a restorative environment for children by replacing excessive screen time with the healing impact of nature.

### **GROW**

Our camps foster new skills that build confidence and promote emotional growth while providing opportunities for kids to meet fellow campers outside their normal social circle.

#### **BE WILD**

Our camps provide campers an opportunity to **JUST BE KIDS!** We give kids a safe space to determine their own risk assessments, developing a critical skill for later in life.

### **Health & Safety at Camp**

At Camp Wonder, we are always thinking safety first. We have certified health officers available 24 hours a day to campers. These health officers are always reviewing our safety policies and procedures.

# PACK: Entering Grades 3 – 4




## **Weekly Themes**

Week 8: July 27–31 – Western Week


Howdy, partners! Campers will enjoy cowboy-style games, crafts, and outdoor challenges inspired by the Wild West.

# A Day in the Life of Summer Campers

# **Ways to Save**

\$50.00 sibling discount: When two or more siblings are registered for the same week, every registration past the first, will get \$50.00 off. The more siblings and weeks you register for the more you save! You must register all siblings at the same time.

**Early Registration Discount:** Register early for the best rates! Prices increase February 1<sup>st</sup> and then on on May 1<sup>st</sup>. The sooner you register, the more you save!



# Registration

## **Registration Process:**

- Visit us at https://www.howellnaturecenter.org/campwonder/ and click the **Register Now** button. You'll be asked to set up an account to register.
- Add each child that you are looking to register to your account. Remember to choose the grade the child is
  entering in the fall.
- Once all potential campers are added, you will be able to view which camps are available for their grade level and which weeks still have openings.
- Add the weeks to your cart and move to the paperwork step.
- All paperwork must be completed to finish registration. A spot will not be held if you stop midway through registration.
- Friend requests can be made during the registration process as long as both children are in the same age group. We will do our best to honor these requests.
- Once the deposit is made and payment is set up, registration is done and you are all set.

## **Payment plans:**

After registering, you can pay your camp fees in full or split the fees into smaller payments. These payments are setup through the online registration with a credit or debit card. Camp fees are divided into equal payments that are automatically processed.

Please note that there is an application fee of \$10.00 per child.

### **Deposits:**

Day camps have a \$50.00 deposit per week, per child. Deposits must be made to complete registration. If you are unable to pay, please email us at summercamps@howellnaturecenter.org.

All deposits are non-refundable.

### What to expect:

Following registration, you will receive a detailed confirmation e-mail which includes a parent information packet, packing lists, and more! If you don't receive a confirmation e-mail, please check your spam folder.

### **Cancellation/Refund Policy:**

Cancellations must be submitted via e-mail to **summercamps@howellnaturecenter.org.** Requests made at least two weeks before the start of a camp session will get a refund of all fees, minus the deposit. Cancellations made within two weeks of a camp session start date, forfeit all fees. Day camp operates rain or shine and we offer activities as the weather permits. Refunds are not offered for bad weather. No shows are not permitted to switch days and are considered day-of cancellations.

# **Special note:**

If you were looking for a five day week, but you find that option is already full, check the option of registering the three and two day option for that week.

Waitlists are also available.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

# Whether you're new here of just need a refresher, we're here to help!

We've rounded up the questions we get asked the most to save you some time. From how to reach us or what to pack you'll likely find the answers below.

### I need to change my campers' registration?

The best way to make registration adjustments is to e-mail us at: <a href="mailto:summercamps@howellnaturecenter.org">summercamps@howellnaturecenter.org</a>. While we don't maintain a year-round summer camp phone line, we do have a Day Camp phone number (810- 599-0367) when camp is in session. This line is primarily used to let us know about early pick-ups, late drop-offs, or absences. If you call with a question, our Day Camp staff may be able to assist, but they will most likely direct you to our Summer Camps email for the quickest and most accurate response.

## Do I need to send lunch with my camper?

Yes! You will need to send lunch with your camper. It's recommended to pack it in an insulated lunch box with cold packs or ice packs, as we don't have enough refrigerator space for everyone's lunch. You're welcome to pack items that contain nuts, but we do ask that campers do not share food with others.

### Are snacks provided by Camp Wonder?

Yes! Campers will receive a snack around 3:30 PM each day before check out. If your camper has a food allergy, please be sure to list it on our health form during registration so our Camp Health Officers can arrange for an appropriate snack.

## What else should I be sending with my camper?

Please refer to the packing list in our Parent Guide online for the full list of what to bring. The essentials include items like a backpack, lunch, water bottle, swimsuit, towel, sunscreen, and a change of clothes. And please make sure to label everything with your child's name so we can easily return any misplaced items.

#### What happens if the weather is bad, does camp still run?

Yes. We make every effort to ensure that our campers spend time outdoors, but when the weather goes down we've got it covered. We are a rain-or-shine camp! Activities will continue outdoors as long as there is no lightning or thunder. On rainy days, we recommend that campers bring a raincoat, rain boots, or an umbrella to stay comfortable.

#### My camper doesn't know how to swim yet should I send a lifejacket with them?

Every child will take a swim test conducted by our certified Red Cross lifeguards and will be assigned a swim section based on their skill level. However, if you would like your child to wear a life jacket during swim time, we are more than happy to accommodate that request. Just include it in the camper notes section during registration or let the day camp staff know upon arrival. Please note that life jackets are required on our fishing dock, during any boating activity, and while using our aqua toys and will be supplied to your child.

#### Can my camper be put in the same group as their friends?

We're happy to accommodate friend requests as long as the campers are in the same age group. During registration, you'll find a section where you can list any friends your camper would like to be grouped with. Please note that if behavioral issues arise, our day camp staff may need to separate certain friend groups for the well-being of the campers. If that occurs, we will communicate with parents or guardians to keep you informed.

### I need to pick my camper up early from camp, what should I do?
