Dear Mr. Dettelbach,

We write to express our deep concerns about the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives' (ATF) new proposed <u>rule</u>, which restricts the right of Americans to sell firearms. The ATF's rule greatly expands the meaning of when a person is considered "engaged in the business" of dealing in firearms, to impose strict licensing requirements on private individuals who occasionally sell firearms.

This proposed rule will arbitrarily restrict law-abiding Americans' constitutional rights while imposing unreasonable compliance costs. In addition, this rule will prove counterproductive and won't deter crime in any way. Clearly, this rule is the quintessential example of an agency of the Executive Branch writing rules diametrically opposed to the intent and will of Congress.

Most gun sales are already conducted by firearm dealers who are Federal Firearm Licensees (FFLs). While the proposed rule does not establish a minimum numerical threshold for selling firearms, the ATF fabricates presumptions of when an individual needs to have an FFL that go far beyond its statutory authority to do so.

These requirements will drive up costs on law-abiding Americans. The process of obtaining an FFL (Type-01) is extremely onerous, time-consuming, and expensive. Law-abiding Americans who occasionally sell guns online as a hobby would now be subject to fees, background checks, fingerprinting, and hours of paperwork—in addition to any existing state and local laws. They would be required to keep and maintain numerous records for life. They could also be subjected to opening their home for ATF inspections. The list of absurd requirements goes on and on. Regulating a perfectly legal hobby in the same way as a federally licensed gun store is nonsensical.

With these concerns in mind, please answer the following questions:

- 1. Since the proposed rule itself states that the presumptions shall not apply to criminal cases, how will the rulemaking have any impact on the most dangerous elements of society, including cartels, gang members, firearm smugglers, and other violent offenders?
- 2. Given that the vast majority of firearms sold in America are used lawfully, what indication does the ATF have that imposing such unreasonable compliance costs on private citizens will reduce criminal activity?

This administration has time and time again targeted Americans' right to bear arms. This new rule is no exception. No amount of burdensome federal regulation can negate the clarity of the Second Amendment. We look forward to receiving your response within 60 days.
