Just Like Jesus

What if, for one day, Jesus were to become you? What if, for twenty-four hours, Jesus wakes up in your bed, walks in your shoes, lives in your house, assumes your schedule? Your boss becomes his boss, your mother becomes his mother, your pains become his pains? What if for one day Jesus lived your life with his heart? Your life is led by the heart of Christ for one full day. His priorities govern your actions. His passions drive your decisions. His love directs your behavior.

What would you be like? Would people notice a change? Your family - would they see something new? Your coworkers - would they sense a difference? Would you treat them the same? And your friends? Would they detect more joy? How about your enemies? Would they receive more mercy from Christ's heart than from yours? What if everything about us - what we thought, what we said, and how we acted, for one day, was just like Jesus? Would anyone notice anything different about us?

God loves you just the way you are. If you think his love for you would be stronger if your faith were, you are wrong. God loves you just the way you are, but he refuses to leave you that way. He wants you to be just like Jesus. The theological term for that is sanctification. The seminary word for that is spiritual formation. The everyday church word for that is discipleship. Our desire as followers of Jesus Christ is to be just like the Master—just like Jesus. And friends, that is what God desires for each of us.

On Sunday, September 14th, we will begin a seven week preaching series entitled, "Just Like Jesus." We will consider some great Gospel passages that will challenge us to have a heart just like Jesus. A compassionate heart, a worship hungry heart, a forgiving heart, a hope-filled heart, and an enduring heart are just some of the themes we will cover. My sincere prayer is that this series will help us to be more like Jesus

I John 2:5-6 says, "This is how we know we are in him: Whoever claims to live in him must walk as Jesus did." For seven weeks, let us consider the heart of Jesus and let us aspire to walk as Jesus did as we become just like Jesus. I am looking forward to our journey together to Christlikeness as we begin this series on September 14th.

Annual Conference 2025

The 238th recorded Annual Conference of the Church of the Brethren was held at the Koury Convention Center in Greensboro NC Wednesday July 2 to Sunday July 6. The theme for this conference was Faith Working Through Love. We stayed in the hotel that was a part of this convention center. The hotel had 28 floors....and only 4 elevators... That caused a few challenges and delays when many of the conference attendees tried to go to and from their rooms...all at the same time. There were 1342 registered attendees: 409 delegates and 933 non-delegates.

Delegates: Pastor Kevin, Mary Etta and Ed Reinhart. In 2025, we changed the way we reported membership to the denomination. We removed our inactive members from the numbers we sent. We expected to have our allotted delegates changed from 3 delegates back to 2 delegates. But when we arrived, we were told that they were using the number we reported in 2024, and we were supposed to have 3 delegates. They had already listed Ed as a delegate and assigned him to a delegate table.

Worship: There was a worship service every evening, Wednesday through Saturday, and then a worship service on Sunday morning where next year's Annual Conference Moderator, Don Fitzkee from Lancaster COB, was consecrated. Dava Hensley, this year's annual conference moderator, spoke at the Wednesday evening service. On Thursday evening, there was a "cowbell" service where three different pastors each had exactly 10 minutes to speak. At the end of 10 minutes, a cowbell was rung, and they had to stop. The music for each worship service was very interesting with a wide variety of singing and music styles. There was a fabulous organist named Jonathan Emmons, and a fabulous pianist named Alex Ramirez. Alex is from Philadelphia First COB.

Equipping sessions and other special opportunities

On Thursday, Friday and Saturday, there were a wide variety of other opportunities to learn more about what is going on in the denomination.

For example, there was an **exhibit hall** with displays from the Bethany Seminary, Eder Financial and the Church of the Brethren Denomination. We were quite surprised when we approached the display for the denomination and saw a photo of Ruth Richardson, Doris Snyder and myself. This photo was taken when we were serving with Brethren Disaster Ministries at Dawson Springs last November.

There was also a wide variety of breakfast and dinner events. Pastor Kevin, Ed and I attended the Brethren Disaster Ministries breakfast on Friday morning where they were scrolling a wide variety of photos from their various ministries. We were surprised to see a photo that included our own Lori Holzhauer and Bobbie Davis in the background.

I also personally enjoyed attending several equipping sessions that focused on the work of Global Missions. One session had 2 pastors from the newly formed Church of the Brethren in Honduras and a representative from a Church of the Brethren in the Dominican Republic where there are many Haitian members. I also attended an equipping session that shared an update on the terrible conditions of the church in DR Congo where members of the violent M23 group have overrun the city of Goma. Church members are largely in hiding and mostly unable to live their normal lives. At another session we met Athanasus Ungang from South Sudan. The political situation there is also very bad. The COB has helped several of the pastors in South Sudan get their families to safety in Uganda while the pastors continue preaching and leading churches in South Sudan.

Business: The various business items were available in the gathering area in the weeks before Annual Conference.

3 Items of Unfinished Business:

<u>UB1 Standing with People of Color:</u> This was the final report of a study committee that was organized after the 2022 Annual Conference. This was a lengthy report that "asked our congregations to study the teachings of Jesus and how they apply to our relationships with all people of color." In the conclusion for this report, there was a statement that said "it is our prayer that the Church of the Brethren will continue to be a welcome home for people of all skin colors and from all ethnic backgrounds." The delegate body "received" the final report of the committee.

<u>UB2 – Breaking Down Barriers – Increasing Access to Denominational Events:</u> This was another final report from a study committee that was organized after the 2022 Annual Conference. This study focused on a variety of barriers that are encountered by people participating in denominational events. These barriers include physical barriers for those who are blind, deaf, or otherwise physically handicapped. There are also other barriers that are more financial. This includes the cost of travel and participating in the Annual Conference and other denominational events. One of the recommendations included the idea of holding the in-person Annual Conference every 2 years with a possible virtual conference in the off-years. My understanding is that the Mission and Ministry Board may continue this discussion in the future. The report itself was "received" by the conference delegates.

UB3 – Request for an Annual Conference Study on Calling Denominational Leadership. This was also the final report that originated in 2022 at the request of the denomination's nominating committee. At the 2023 Annual Conference, a study committee was put together to study this issue. There is an ongoing struggle to find qualified people who will agree to have their names put on the ballot to fill leadership roles at the denominational level. A part of the discussion on this included a request to use a slate with only one person being named for a position, in place of a ballot with two or more names. The decision was made that we must have at least two names to present to the standing committee for their consideration. Other recommendations from this study were

referred to the Review and Evaluation Committee that will be meeting in the future to look at a wide range of processes used by the denomination to consider what changes need to be made. With this in mind, this report was "received" by the delegates.

6 Items of New Business:

NB 1, 2, and 3: Recommendations to renew Agency status: The first 3 items of new business involved approving a covenant between three agencies of the Church of the Brethren. These agencies are Bethany Theological Seminary, Eder Financial (previously known as Brethren Benefit Trust) and On Earth Peace. These are organizations that function separately from the denomination but are closely related. Again, at the 2022 Annual Conference there was a decision made that these organizations needed to have a covenant drawn up defining their relationship to denomination. All three of these covenants were approved and the agency status was renewed.

NB 4: Reducing Harm: Interim steps to address suffering: This was probably the most difficult item to discuss. There is a well-known 1983 statement entitled "Human Sexuality from a Christian Perspective.) One of the statements in that 1983 paper affirms that covenantal relationships between homosexual persons are not an "acceptable" lifestyle for a Christian. That 1983 paper and the statements in it were not changed at this conference.

NB 5: Concerns about Current Practices Related to Matters of Sexuality: This item of business primarily focused on the fact that the ways that our various districts within the COB enforce policies related to human sexuality in very different ways. This query was asking how we can be more consistent among our various districts. The delegates referred the question in this query to the Review and Evaluation Committee.

NB 6: <u>Recommended Cost of Living Adjustment to the Minimum Cash Salary Table for Pastors.</u> The recommendation from the Standing Committee for a Cost-of-Living Adjustment of 2.6% was approved.

Annual Conference next year – 2026 - will be held from June 28 to July 2 in Fort Wayne IN. We want to thank the church for the opportunity to represent you at this conference.


