If you desire prayers for yourself or others, you may go to the back of the church after Holy Communion or after the dismissal, and either the clergy or a member from Daughters of the King will pray with you.

Older students will be asked to be good stewards and help assist the younger children in the classroom. Our class for youth (6th grade and up) called "Our Journey with God" meets in Classroom A, offered simultaneously with "Worship and Wonder."


