Sunday—Read John 2:1-11

Monday—Read Luke 14:7-11

Jesus tells a parable about where to sit at a wedding. Make a seating chart for Jesus' idea of a wedding feast.

Tuesday—Read Luke 14:15-24

Jesus tells a parable about guests who refuse an invitation and are replaced. Write an invitation for the servant to use to bring guests into the feast.

Wednesday—Read Psalm 104:10-16

The psalmist sings a celebration of God's abundance. Draw a picture that depicts the scene using the images from these verses.

Thursday—Read Revelation 19:1-10

Marriage imagery is used to describe the heavenly kingdom. What are the most difficult or troubling lines in this passage for you? Why?

Friday—Read Isaiah 25:6-9

The prophet promises salvation and joy at God's great feast. Write out a menu for the feast that is promised.

Saturday—Read Psalm 23:1-6

The psalmist celebrates God's protection and abundance with the image of a feast. Why is it important the feast described is prepared in the presence of enemies?
