

Morton Plant Hospital Receives Global Recognition as a “Baby-Friendly” Hospital for Fourth Time

Has Maintained Designation Longer than Any Other Facility in Florida

CLEARWATER, Fla., (December 3, 2018)— For the fourth time, Morton Plant Hospital has received “Baby-Friendly” designation from the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF). The hospital first earned the “Baby-Friendly” status in 2003 and has been designated “Baby-Friendly” longer than any other facility in Florida. Each designation is good for five years.

Launched in 1991, the Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative is a global effort to implement practices that protect, promote and support breastfeeding, safe feeding practices and maternal infant bonding. A maternity facility is awarded “Baby-Friendly” status after meeting requirements established by WHO and UNICEF and following the *10 Steps of Successful Breastfeeding*. There are more than 20,000 designated “Baby-Friendly” hospitals and birth centers worldwide.

“We are proud to have earned the “Baby-Friendly” designation once again,” said Shari Crowe, director of Women’s Services at Morton Plant Hospital. “From breastfeeding classes before birth to nursing help immediately after birth to support groups when the family goes home, our team is committed to helping each mother succeed in breastfeeding her child.”
