<p><b>World in the Classroom: Honoring Students' and Teachers' Identities and Experiences</b> Children feel safe and motivated to learn when teachers incorporate their diverse lives and experiences in the classroom. Further, as the CA ELA/ELD Framework acknowledges, in order for students to function in our 21<sup>st</sup> Century world, it is crucial for them to learn to "value and respect diverse views and experiences." However, teachers, administrators, school staff may often feel overwhelmed by the responsibility of exploring such concepts as race, gender, economic class, and family structure with young children. This interactive presentation will introduce practices that explore the cultural worlds of students and teachers while building confidence among students, celebrating diversity, strengthening community, and creating an environment where every student feels affirmed, acknowledged and accepted.</p>	Time: 4:45-5:35
<p><b>Lead for Equity: The Power of Dual Language Programs</b> Dual Language programs are a viable and transformative resource to create equitable classrooms that multilingual students deserve, and with an informed, motivated and visionary leader, they can become a reality! This session is designed to elevate and inspire school leaders as they plan, implement, and strengthen elementary dual language programs and will draw from the recently released CDE book, <u>Improving Multilingual and English Learner Education: from Research to Practice</u>. School leaders will be invited to think critically about dual language programming as an opportunity to lead for equity, continuous improvement, and collaboration. In particular, leaders in this session will discuss the common challenges of implementation such as whole school versus strand, how to partner with and engage the variety of school community members, including families, staff, BOEs, and students, and how to advance complex school systems toward equity as an advocate for effective pedagogical practices that leverage biliteracy.</p>	Time: 4:45-5:35
<p><b>Coaching: The Essential Role to Enact Powerful, Lasting Reform</b> Implementing lasting systems change, as prescribed by the CA EL Roadmap, requires the essential role of a Coach to hold the vision of success for Language Learners. Activities will prepare participants to articulate an approach in their district to create structures that enable powerful teacher collaboration centralizing DLLs. <p><b>Title: Tools and Techniques for Planning Responsive DELD Lessons</b> Need help planning "in response to" DELD lessons?
