Each year, NMFAPC members are encouraged to bring policy issues for consideration that fall generally within the contours of the Policy Council enunciated preamble, mission, vision, values, purposes, and guiding principles. Policy issues proposed for support at the upcoming legislative session will receive further consideration and deliberation by the Policy Council. Each qualifying legislative proposal will be placed on one of five Tiers (lead, endorse, support, neutral or oppose). The Legislative Team will act in the capacity to implement the Tier placement selections and is given discretion to make immediate decisions during the Legislative Session with the obligation to report back formally to the full Policy Council membership.

Guidelines for Proposals

The Policy Council reviews requests for potential legislation using the following criteria:

- Does it have statewide or potential statewide focus or impact.
- AND any of the following:
- Advance keeping food grown, raised, processed and consumed in NM.
 - Supports the NMFAPC Values and Equity Statements.
 - Does the issue already have sufficient lobbying support?
 - Does the issue have support of the food and agriculture communities?
 - Does it fit within the capacity of our lobbyist to contribute actual lobbying support (aside from tracking)?
 - Is it politically viable?

Proposals submitted using this form will have priority by the Legislative Team. Proposals that do not meet these guidelines will not be accepted. NM Food and Agriculture Experiential Learning Grant Program:

Maintain the following programs and funding in the NM Public Education Student Success & Wellness Bureau budget 2021-22 (FY 2022) request to the legislature:

- 1) Breakfast After the Bell
- 2) NM Grown Fruits and Vegetables for School Meals
- 3) Reduce Co-Pay for School Meals

It is important to maintain these school nutrition programs now and beyond the pandemic as vital to school meal programs.

Due to the Covid-19, NM school nutrition programs face major budget shortfalls. As schools are closed and have had to adapt to “curbside meal pick up” many school districts are experiencing lower numbers in participation for many reason. Yet, at the same time school districts continue to prepare meals, pay for the food and staff to prepare the meals. Any meals not picked up my students and families cannot be reimbursed through the federal school meal programs. Thus, School Food Authorities continue to pay for food and staff without being reimbursed for some of those costs. Even meeting payroll is a struggle. School Districts are having to help support the school nutrition programs.
