SUBMISSION

Each year, NMFAPC members are encouraged to bring policy issues for consideration that fall generally within the contours of the Policy Council enunciated preamble, mission, vision, values, purposes, and guiding principles. Policy issues proposed for support at the upcoming legislative session will receive further consideration and deliberation by the Policy Council. Each qualifying legislative proposal will be placed on one of five Tiers (lead, endorse, support, neutral or oppose). The Legislative Team will act in the capacity to implement the Tier placement selections and is given discretion to make immediate decisions during the Legislative Session with the obligation to report back formally to the full Policy Council membership.

Guidelines for Proposals

The Policy Council reviews requests for potential legislation using the following criteria:

- Does it have statewide or potential statewide focus or impact.
- AND any of the following:
- Advance keeping food grown, raised, processed and consumed in NM.
 - Supports the NMFAPC Values and Equity Statements.
 - Does the issue already have sufficient lobbying support?
 - Does the issue have support of the food and agriculture communities?
 - Does it fit within the capacity of our lobbyist to contribute actual lobbying support (aside from tracking)?
 - Is it politically viable?

Proposals submitted using this form will have priority by the Legislative Team. Proposals that do not meet these guidelines will not be accepted. 1. Brief description of proposed legislation (450 characters, maximum)

The Public Banking Act will establish a State Public Bank to improve the state's focus, efficiency and effectiveness in the management of its funds. The public bank's mission is to collaborate with community banks, credit unions and local governments in order to increase social capital, extend infrastructure and regenerates natural assets. Among these investments would be regenerative agriculture, expanding food production and processing, and protect water resources and the environment.

The Alliance for Local Economic Prosperity (AFLEP), New Mexico's Public Banking Think Tank, has been working for 10 years to bring a public bank to New Mexico. The proposed public bank for New Mexico would accept and invest only public funds, working with local governments and school districts to provide infrastructure loans in place of expensive bonds, and with community banks, credit unions and Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI) to partner on loan programs for local economic development. Local investment keeps money circulating in the community, and the interest returns to the state to be used again and again at the local level.
