**AGRICULTURE**

- [Organic Agriculture Research and Extension Initiative](#)

**Purpose:** The purpose of this program is to fund projects that will enhance the ability of producers and processors who have already adopted organic standards to grow and market high quality organic agricultural products.

**Eligible Applicants:** Institutions of higher education, research institutions, as well as private organizations with relevant experience.

**Funding Information:** \$25,000,000 in total funding.

**Deadline:** January 14th, 2021

## COMMUNITY SERVICE

**Purpose:** AmeriCorps grants are awarded to eligible organizations proposing to engage AmeriCorps members in evidence-based or evidence-informed interventions/practices to strengthen communities. See link above for a list of the program's FY 2021 priorities.

## CRIMINAL JUSTICE

- [OVW Fiscal Year 2021 Justice for Families Program Solicitation](#)

**Purpose:** Provides funding to improve the response of the civil and criminal justice system to families with a history of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, or in cases involving allegations of child sexual abuse. Examples include programs to facilitate supervised visitation and safe exchange by and between parents, training for people who work with families in the court system, and the provision of resources for juveniles, among other purposes.

**Eligible Applicants:** State, local, and tribal governments, as well as nonprofits and victims service providers.

**Funding Information:** \$13,000,000 in total funding, 23 awards expected.

## ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- [EDA CARES Act Recovery Assistance](#)

**Purpose:** Through this funding opportunity, the Economic Development Administration has modified the Economic Adjustment Assistance program to better help communities respond to and prepare for economic disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Examples of eligible projects include economic recovery and resiliency planning, implementing entrepreneurial support programs, and completing public works projects that will support economic recovery (e.g. broadband deployment to support telehealth and remote learning). EDA expects to fund between 80 and 100 percent of eligible project costs.

**Eligible Applicants:** State, local, and tribal governments, as well as Economic Districts, nonprofits, and institutions of higher education.

**Funding Information:** \$1,500,000,000 in total funds.

**Deadline:** First-come, first-serve

**Purpose:** Provides investments that support regional innovation intended to address the economic, health, and safety risks caused by the coronavirus pandemic through entrepreneurship and innovation.

**Eligible Applicants:** State, local, and tribal governments, as well as institutions of higher education and nonprofit organizations.

**Funding Information:** \$25,000,000 in total funding, 100 awards expected.

**Purpose:** Provides financial assistance to eligible applicants that will provide service at or above the Broadband Grant Speed to all premises in rural, economically-challenged communities where broadband service does not exist.

## EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

**Purpose:** Supports efforts to reduce or eliminate the risk of repetitive flood damage to buildings and structures insured under the National Flood Insurance Program.

**Eligible Applicants:** State and tribal governments. Local governments may apply through the state government.

**Funding Information:** \$160,000,000 in total funds, 35 awards expected.

**Deadline:** January 29th, 2021

- [FY20 Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities](#)

**Purpose:** Provides funding to increase governmental capacity to identify pre-disaster mitigation actions and implement projects that reduce risks posed by natural hazards.

**Eligible Applicants:** State and tribal governments. Local governments may apply through the state government.

**Funding Information:** \$500,000,000 in total funds, 125 awards expected.

**Deadline:** January 29th, 2021

## ENVIRONMENT/PUBLIC LANDS

- [Interventions and Communication Strategies to Reduce Health Risks of Wildland Fire Smoke Exposures](#)

**Purpose:** Funds research proposals that will address behavioral, technical, and practical aspects of interventions and communication strategies to reduce exposures and/or health risks of wildland fire smoke.

**Eligible Applicants:** State, local, and tribal governments, as well as nonprofit organizations and institutions of higher education.

**Funding Information:** \$5,000,000 in total funding, 5 awards expected.

**Purpose:** Funds may be used to evaluate current landfill conditions to determine threats to water resources, provide technical assistance and/or training to enhance the operation and maintenance of active landfills, and provide technical assistance and/or training to help communities reduce the solid waste stream.

**Purpose:** The purpose of this Indian Health Service grant is to address the opioid crisis in American Indian communities by developing and expanding community education and awareness of prevention, treatment and/or recovery activities for opioid misuse and opioid use disorder.

**Eligible Applicants:** Public Housing Authorities.

**Funding Information:** \$15,000,000 in total funding, 5 awards expected.

**Deadline: December 1st, 2020**

- [FY2020 Choice Neighborhoods Implementation Grant Program](#)

**Purpose:** Supports the implementation of comprehensive neighborhood revitalization plans that will replace distressed public and assisted housing with high-quality mixed-income housing that will contribute to improved household and neighborhood outcomes related to employment and income, health, and children's education in the target jurisdiction.

**Eligible Applicants:** Local and tribal governments, as well as public housing authorities and Indian housing authorities.

## INDIAN COUNTRY

- [Indian Housing Block Grant \(IHBG\) - Competitive Grant Program](#)

**Purpose:** Under the program, eligible Indian tribes and tribally designated housing entities (TDHEs) receive grants to carry out a range of affordable housing activities. Grant funds may be used to develop, maintain, and operate affordable housing in safe and healthy environments on Indian reservations and in other Indian areas and carry out other affordable housing activities. Grant funds must be used to primarily benefit low-income Indian families.

**Eligible Applicants:** Indian Tribes and Tribally Designated Housing Entities

**Funding Information:** \$91,013,382 in total funds, 20 awards expected.

## MUSEUMS/LIBRARIES/THE ARTS

- [FY2020 Historic Preservation Fund- African American Civil Rights- Preservation Grants](#)

**Purpose:** Provides funding to preserve the sites and stories of the full history of the African American struggle to gain equal rights as citizens and the transatlantic slave trade. Preservation of historic sites and projects concerning the documentation of historical records will be funded under two separate funding opportunities.

**Eligible Applicants:** State, local, and tribal governments, as well as nonprofits and institutions of higher education.

## SCIENCE/TECHNOLOGY

**Purpose:** The purpose of this program is to support research, education/teaching, and extension projects that increase participation by women and underrepresented minorities from rural areas in STEM. NIFA intends this program to address educational needs within broadly defined areas of food, agriculture, natural resources, and human (FANH) sciences.

**Eligible Applicants:** Institutions of higher education, private organizations, and research foundations.
