- 8. Our 2016 membership directory program was a success. 865 members purchased the directory, earning \$10,618 for our Association. Publishing Concepts Inc. (PCI) also helped to reconnect with 82 former members who rejoined the CPOA.
- 9. The CPOA was officially accepted as Associate Member in the Veterans Day National Committee, which is administered by the Department of Veterans Affairs. This is a very prestigious honor as many Military Associations who apply for membership are repeatedly turned down. Our Association will now be permitted to carry the CPOA & CGEA flags at the annual Veterans Day ceremony held at Arlington National Cemetery. While participation each year is very limited, some of our members will be invited to the White House for breakfast with the President and/or place a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.
- 10. THE CPOA CHARITABLE FOUNDATION The CGCPO Charitable Foundation has received final approval from the IRS to serve as a 501(c)(3) non-profit, and the initial donation from CWO (Ret) Fred Mann was received on 1 July. Tax-deductible donations are now being accepted and the donations to the Foundation's Fred Mann Family Lucky Bag Fund will be used to provide financial assistance to members of our Coast Guard Family in need. My thanks to the Foundation's Board of Directors President YNCM (Ret) Forrest Croom, Vice President HSCM Jason Wong, Secretaries ITCS Nia Stemley & YN2 Carly Beer, and Treasurer Mrs. Janet Cantrell for serving as the Foundation's first Officers. More information will be published in the October edition of *The Chief* magazine, as well as in future newsletters and posted on our website.
- 11. In closing, our Association's financial situation is strong and our membership numbers remain steady. Our Chapters and Branches continue to give their best to keep our Association strong and thriving, and our members are second to none. I am honored to serve as your President, and thank you for your continued support of the CPOA and CGEA.

COMPUTER SYSTEM

- a. The ED's new computer system and software (Adobe Acrabat Suite enabeling us in-office production of *The Chief*) are running properly. All other computer systems and the membership database are running as required.
- b. Weekly computer backups are conducted to ensure database integrity.

WEBSITE

 a. Our webmasters CWO Michael Babischkin and BMC Phillip Null, and Webmaster Emeritus QMCM Joe D'Elia developed a new website utilizing Wordpress which went live 15 July.

ACCOUNTING

- a. Continue to utilize Quickbooks Online Essentials. National Treasurer has access to ensure continued transparency and oversight.
- b. Yearly taxes submitted on time.
- c. Continue to work closely with the Budget Committee and the BOD to optimize our annual budget based upon actual expenditures.

CCCAF

a. CCCAF information was published in the January edition of "The Chief" and posted on our website and e-newsletter. Received and processed 22 applications; provided to CCCAF Chair for grading. President sent the congratulatory letter to the winners (3) and the scholarship "Big Checks" were mailed for presentation. Letters of acknowledgement were sent to all individuals who participated in this year's program.

COMMUNICATION

- a. The Chief:
 - Membership Coordinator continues to attend to our transiet members in our database. The April issue of The Chief resulted in 6 magazines returned, down from a high of 457 in 2011-2012.
- b. E-Newsletter:
 - Presently sending to over 8,100 contacts, up from 7,400 last year.
 - Still receiving above average open rate (40.0%) and click through rate (27.0%). Similar industry rates (non-profit organizations) are 24.5% and 15.4% respectively.
- c. Facebook:
 - The CPOA Facebook page remains a valuable communication platform to quickly spread awareness about key issues, mobilize supporters, raise funds, and create online advocacy movements.
 - Page has 3011 Likes, up from 2275 last year.
 - The CGEA Facebook page managed by CGEA members presently has 890 Likes (up from 388 last year).
- d. LinkedIn:
 - Presently has 1495 members, up from 1383 last year.
- e. Twitter:
 - Presently has 390 followers, up from 326 last year.
- f. Mobile App:
 - Still available to members.

THE MILITARY COALITION (TMC)

- a. Elected to serve as the TMC's Treasurer.
- b. Posted all minutes to website and published 2015 legislative victories in the April edition of The Chief and in our e-newsletter.
- c. Posted over 10 TMC and/or VSO letters to our website and e-newsletters
- d. 2016 legislative goals published in our e-newsletter.
- e. Continue to work closely with Coalitions' communication committee to improve our outreach. With over 5.5 million combined members, having a social media strategy could substantially increase our strength and influence. Working on a concept with other VSO's to combine Voters Voice access to all of TMC members in order to connect all combined membership with legislators.

TMC continues to increase its reputation on the Hill. Representing more than five million members, the 32-member Coalition is squarely positioned to make considerable gains in the coming years as we fight for members rights and benefits.

MEMBERSHIP

- a. We presently have 8267 CPOA members and 1513 CGEA members (a decrease of 90 from last year). HYT and CRSP continued to impact our membership numbers this year.
- b. Since 1 July 2015, the MC has opened 657 new memberships (347 CPOA & 310 CGEA).
- c. Since 1 July 2015, 210 of our members Crossed the Bar.
- d. The MC will mail 25-year pins to 181 eligible members this year.
- e. The MC has increased communication with past due members and has developed new dues renewal communication emails, a new welcome aboard letter, a rejoin request letter, and a 2nd dues not received letter.

STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS

a. USAA – Continues to provide \$10,000 as part of our annual partnership compensation. They are also sending a quarterly affinity check averaging \$1,200. We recently extended our contract to August 2021.

b. New partnership obtained with LegalShield, providing membership identity theaft and legal services discounts.

OTHER

- a. Our 2016 membership directory with Publishing Concepts Inc. (PCI) was developed and sent to purchasing members in June. PCI sold 865 directories and reconnected 82 members back to the Association resulting in \$10,618 in added revenue.
- b. We were officially inducted as an Associate Member in the Veterans Day National Committee. Each year, we will now proudly parade our CPOA flag at the annual Veterans Day ceremony held at Arlington National Cemetery and some of our members will actually be able to have breakfast with the President at the White House and/or place a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.
- 2. This has been another great year at National. Financially, we closed out FY 2015 \$286 over budget due to unanticipated computer/software expenditures and legal fees associated with setting up our new CPOA Charitable Foundation. Pending any further unplanned purchases, I expect us to be solidly in the black in 2016. We continue to increase our communication outreach, and welcomed two new Chapters and two new Branches since 1 August 2015. I am honored to be starting my 5th year serving as your Executive Director and greatly appreciate your continuing support.

The Long Range Planning Standing Committee via email communication, has provided information for the following issues:

- 1. Mandatory Membership of the Long Range Planning Committee by the Past National Presidents.
 - a. The committee has submitted a motion to amend the Operations Manual.

2. 50th Year Celebration.

The word "cost" continues to erode the idea of holding our 50th Anniversary Convention in the DC area. We continue to gather information for the DC area and are beginning to look in the Glen Burnie area as well in hopes of lessening the cost impact on the membership.

Two ideas have emerged that may prove viable: 1. Check on facilities at Andrews Air Force Base and Marine Corps Base Quantico, Va. 2. Use of Veterans Service Organization facilities such as a VFW or American Legion Post that could host the event.

- a. Ideas for holding the 50th Celebration/Convention in Washington D C include front end funding to assist in lowering the cost of attending to the membership.
- b. The committee began generating ideas to help defray the cost to the membership. The effort would be to provide front money to the hotel, and or any other facility we would need for this event, thus lowering the cost to the participants and should give us negotiating power for lower rates and/or discounts. The following ideas were generated and shall be explored during the Annual Convention.
 - 1. Chapter be asked to hold a fundraiser each year for the period 2017 and 18, to be designated for the 50th Celebration.
 - 2. Chapters be encouraged to also contribute an additional effort to be completed by the end of March 2019.
 - 3. Establishment of a savings account or other interest bearing account to hold and grow the funds. This could be done either by the Convention Chairman in conjunction with our Convention account, or through the National Office.
 - 4. Check on facilities at Andrews Air Force Base and Marine Corps Base Quantico, Va.
 - 5. Use of Veterans Service Organization facilities such as a VFW or American Legion Post that could host the event.
 - 6. Seek corporate sponsorship.
- 3. Ways to enhance funding The Coast Guard Chief Petty Officers Foundation.
- a. In that the CPOA was entrusted with the formation and administration of the Foundation, and that not only our membership, but the Coast Guard as a whole may benefit, enhancing and encouraging it's funding for continued and long term success is paramount. This initiative should show well on The Foundation and CPOA. Our first idea is to include donations to the Foundation in the current point system for Chapter of the Year and will be discussed during the Annual Convention.

- 2. Certain helpful initiatives were proposed:
 - i) WIIFM Craft a one-page document for distribution at CPO Academy that explains what the CPOA/CGEA is all about with a membership form on the back. (Get the info from the Chief Magazine) Pamphlets will be printed at no cost in coordination with MC Stevens. Significantly of the cost in coordination with MC Stevens.
