Dear members and friends of CLC,

On Sunday, June 6, we celebrate as seven CLC youth affirm the promises God made to them in Holy Baptism. We rejoice that they are dearly loved children of God, forgiven, and called to love and serve Christ in all that they do. They are declaring publicly, "Yes, I believe in God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and I am claiming, as my own, the faith in which I have been raised."

This year in our confirmation ministry, Josiah and I have been sharing what the Bible teaches about life, faith, and our calling to love and serve our neighbors. Our theme verse is: Colossians 1:27

"God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory"

Max Lucado writes: "When grace happens, Christ enters. Christ in you, the hope of glory! For many years, I missed this truth. I believed all the other prepositions: Christ *for* me, Christ *with* me, Christ *ahead* of me. But I never imagined that Christ was *in* me. I can't blame my deficiency on Scripture. Paul refers to the indwelling of Christ 216 times. John mentions his presence 26. No other religion or philosophy makes such a claim. No other movement implies the living presence of its founder in his followers. Muhammad does not indwell Muslims. Buddha does not inhabit Buddhists. Influence? Instruct? Yes. But occupy? No.

The mystery of Christianity is summarized in Colossians 1:27, "Christ is in you!" Little by little a new image emerges! All because of God's Grace!"



Liquid assets available to meet expenses totaled \$96,416 on 4/30/2021 (excludes dedicated funds).

Offering income was \$4,354 more than budgeted for April and is \$11,527 greater than budgeted YTD. Higher offerings have helped to offset the loss of preschool income.

Preschool net income was \$970 more than budgeted for April and is \$8,737 more than budgeted YTD. Licensing and health officials continue to limit our enrollment although we expect full enrollment in September.

Other Receipts included specified gifts of \$54 for the Long-Term Maintenance Fund, \$1,075 for the Food Bank, \$25 for Siloe, \$100 for Laura's House and \$81 for the Quilting.

Non-Preschool Operating Expenses were \$1,700 more than budgeted for April and are \$2,137 less than budgeted YTD. All expense categories were less than budgeted for the month or within \$300 of budget except:

Worship was \$1,029 more than budgeted. Accompanist hours were greater due to Easter preparation, trumpet players were unbudgeted, and extra flowers were purchased.

Facilities were \$1,361 greater than budgeted for April since all fire inspection services and fire extinguisher services were completed this month. Some landscape repairs and palm tree pruning were also completed. YTD expenses are \$470 greater than budgeted.







Sent Out with Good News **John 20:20-21**

After the postponement of our 2020 Pacifica Synod Assembly, our 2021 Assembly was held in a brand-new format, a format very familiar to our congregations over the past year—a virtual, online gathering. Through the gift of technology, 299 voting members and assembly leaders gathered on Zoom from throughout our synod to experience this year's Synod Assembly. Bethlehem Lutheran in Encinitas was our "Mission Control" host site (thank you, Lori Herman, for that description) where a small group gathered safely to host the livestreamed portion of the assembly.

Our theme, "Sent Out with Good News" based on John 20:20-21 couldn't be more relevant in this time in our world. This text shaped our time together as we look ahead and discern the ways we are sent out into this "new" world in ministry together.

We were joined by our ELCA Churchwide Representative and Secretary, Deacon Sue Rothmeyer. Our ministry partners still shared updates and our Synod Council officers provided reports both live and by video. Resolutions were voted on and elections held in new ways that didn't involve red and green cards and printed ballots, but in our homes through the use of our own electronic devices. While agenda items during the Assembly may have been done differently than prior years, the work we did together as a synod was just as meaningful and important as ever and we remain committed as a synod in being sent out to share the Good News of Christ in our world together.

We give thanks to all who were with us for this assembly, both voting members and those who watched the livestream. Your willingness to explore new ways of gathering to do this work together is appreciated. Your participation and dedication to the ministries of and through this synod are a gift to us and the wider church. We also are grateful for those who held the Assembly in prayer. We especially give thanks for the village it takes to hold a synod assembly - our Assembly Planning Team, Synod Council, many gifted volunteers and the staff and members of Bethlehem Lutheran in Encinitas. You are all amazing partners in this ministry!
