

Payroll Protection Program loan funds totaling \$151,527 were received 5/1/2020. These funds will be applied to payroll costs (both church and preschool) and mortgage interest until they are depleted. At that time, we will apply to have the loan forgiven and converted into a grant. We anticipate full loan forgiveness.

Liquid assets available to meet expenses totaled \$13,538 on 5/31/2020 (excludes dedicated funds). Remaining Payroll Protection Program Funds totaled \$98,026 as of 5/31/2020.

Offering income was \$9,367 less than budgeted for May. YTD offerings are \$1,947 less than budgeted.

Preschool net income was \$60,715 less than budgeted for May. No tuition will be received until July, when we will have a 5-week summer program.

Other Receipts included specified gifts of \$54 for the Building Fund, \$363 for Siloé, \$100 for Door of Faith, \$800 for the Food Bank, \$100 for the online worship fund, \$36 for card kit supplies, and \$465 for the Good Samaritan Fund.

Non-Preschool Operating Expenses were \$3,295 less than budgeted for May. All expense categories were below budgeted numbers.

Transfers for May included \$4,000 to the Facility Long Term Maintenance Fund from the church's operating funds. This transfer will continue if the church has positive year-to-date net income.

3. You can give with your phone using the Give Plus App. Just go to the App Store or Google Play and search for "Give+". The first time you login, you select your church. You will find us by searching the zip code, 92688. You can do a one-time donation or setup a recurring donation through the app.
4. You can text an offering donation to 855-949-0112. The first time you do this you will get a text back prompting you to enter your name and credit card number.
5. You can do a Zelle transfer through your online banking website. When adding the church as a payee, just enter our email address: clcrsm@clcrsm.org

Amazon Smile: The church has registered on Amazon Smile. This is a great program where Amazon shoppers can designate any registered charity to receive .5% of their qualified purchases as a donation. Schwab Account: The church has a Schwab brokerage account. This way members can donate shares of stock as an alternative to cash offerings. Not only can you help the church, you can avoid paying capital gains tax on appreciated stocks.






AMAZING FACES

THANK YOU to all who have given your time and talent to make these colorful masks.....wonder where they will go!




