Early in the morning, Mary rose and went to the grave. I don't know what she was expecting to find there except a big rock and a few guards, but she went anyway. That is what the beloved disciple shares in his gospel. Mary got up while it was still dark.

Maybe Mary was unconsciously searching for God despite the seeming reality that God was dead. Maybe she knew that beyond all reason that there was something calling her to that dark, barren place. Maybe the God that dwelled within, drew her to a dark place that would offer a hope despite her knowledge of a cold tomb and a corpse.

For us too. Maybe we know that deep inside, where no-one else can see, there is a light that keeps bringing us back to a place where others seem cold and dead. That is where the hope of truth, unity and love will surprise us. I think that is what Easter is all about. In the midst of rational despair, we are called to find light and truth. We are called beyond reasonable understanding to run into coldness to find warmth and hope.

I must admit that the story's irony annoys me. After all of the unconscious hope and inner call, after the confusion, the voice, the realization and the wonder and all, God doesn't bestow any physical touch. No hug. No kiss. No pat on the back. "Do not touch me," God states. God stays somewhat intangible and distant. Isn't that just like our God, always leaving us wanting more?

So, I promise that when my final early morning comes and I am approaching the resurrected Christ, I will not fall down and adore but sweep Him into my arms for a long embrace. It is overdue.

This past winter was extremely cold and the Hospitality Center in New London had been hosting 80-100 homeless people during the day as a warming center. NCC stepped up to fill the increased need. Just one week's delivery from NCC included 20lbs of coffee, 500 tea bags, snacks and 100 chapsticks! It was warmly received by the center. Collection continues for coffee and tea, sugar, juices and snacks, also travel size personal care items.

The donation center on Jay St has reopened, accepting gently used spring and summer clothing, two bags per donation. It has been renamed the Hope Shoppe, open Tuesday and Thursday 10-2p. Church Financial Sustainability

A stable church funding structure is akin to a three-legged stool, the legs are Annual Pledge Drive, Outright Gifts, and Planned Gifts.

1. Our annual pledge drive supports the church's annual operating budget. Thanks to our faithful members our 2025 results set a new high, we received 127 pledges totaling \$451,780 as of March 31st 2025, an increase of \$29,177 over last year¹. The annual revenue of the church is the sum of members' pledges, cash reserves, and other income sources such as fund raising events, interest & dividend, loose offerings, facility rent, and use fees.
2. Outright gifts are current gifts for a specific program, function, material purchase, or general church purposes. Some recent examples of outright gifts are:
 - a. New A/C air handler for the pastor's and church offices (\$10,000)
 - b. New commercial refrigerator (\$4,000)
 - c. Youth Fellowship, it has a balance of \$12,831 with additional funds donated annually.
 - d. Free will donations to support the annual youth mission trip.
 - e. Memorial fund donations to honor friends and loved ones, and specific gifts to grant scholarships for higher education. It has a balance of \$53,153 as of December 31st, 2024.
 - f. MLK Jr. Scholarship Fund, church members have donated more than \$12,500 each year in 2023, 2024, and 2025. Several anonymous donors led with matching fund every year.
 - g. Numerous gifts from members and friends who purchase goods and services for the church and/or its missions but decline to request reimbursement.
3. A planned gift is a deferred gift from a donor's estate, realized after a donor's death. Unrestricted planned gifts are encouraged, allowing such gifts be used wherever the church's need is greatest. A gift may also go into a restricted fund account if the donor wishes to fund a specific purpose. Planned gifts may reside in different accounts based on donors' gift language:
 - a. Endowment Fund - the Church may only use investment income, while preserving the principal, to support general church purposes stated in the fund's charter. The fund's balance on December 31st, 2024 is \$475,891.
 - b. Named Funds for general purposes, specific programs or purposes such as:
 - i. Named Fund – Beckwith Fund, a component of the Endowment Fund
 - ii. Named Fund – Knapperberger Fund, a component of the Endowment Fund
 - iii. Named Program Fund – Beckwith Bequest for Christian Education
 - iv. Named Program Fund – Beckwith Bequest for Old Stone Burial Ground
 - v. Other Possible Specific Purpose Funds – (1) Building/Infrastructure modernization, (2) Leadership gift, and (3) Real property acquisition.

Previous Stewardship Campaign Results - 2024: 124 pledges, \$422,603; 2023: 119 pledges, \$422,303; 2022: 118 pledges, \$403,952

Answer:

We are fortunate that we have a copy of a diary that Sylvanus Griswold, grandson of our first minister, kept. It covers from 1799-1813. In it he mentions attending Sunday meetings in the "Boston Quarter" schoolhouse. Schools in those days had either fireplaces or stoves and were smaller and easier to heat. He even tells how many "soals" were in attendance and that ranged from 40 to 111.

Trivia: *Our lights and heat are now automated and programmed and can all be operated remotely.*


