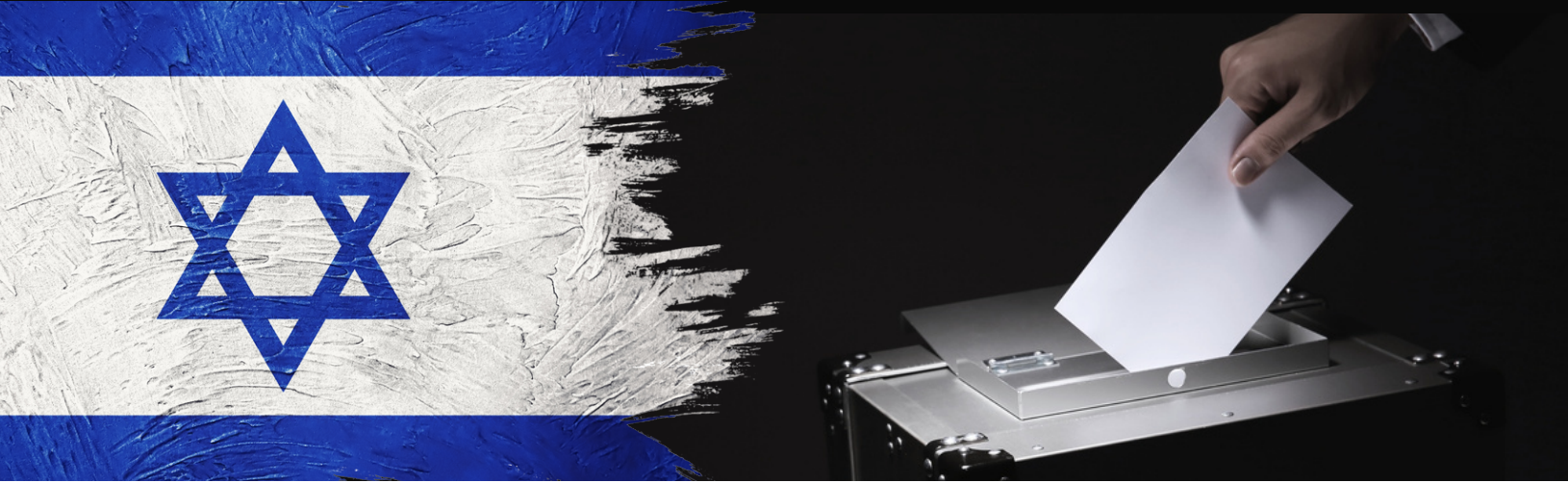


ISRAEL AT A CROSSROADS: UNDERSTANDING THE UPCOMING OCTOBER 2026 ELECTIONS

As Israel approaches national elections on Oct. 27, the country finds itself at a pivotal moment. Many observers view these elections as a crossroads, one that could shape Israel's political direction, social fabric, relationship with the region, and international standing for years to come.
