Vicki Manley

I am in my 30s and have experience of volunteering and have been looking for a new opportunity during lockdown. Using the skills and experience I have, I have been encouraged to apply to Age UK H&W.

It is a great opportunity to interact with people in the community and knowing that I am helping to make a difference - makes me feel really good.

Where do you volunteer? Age UK H&W

What do you do as a volunteer? The Companion Line supports people across Herefordshire and Worcestershire with a regular phone call. I was matched with a client who has similar interests and hobbies to me. As a Companion Line volunteer I ring the client and have a half hour call with them. The calls are a very varied, we mainly talk about life in general and using the time to help the client enjoy some social engagement.

Why do you like volunteering? I enjoy the volunteering role, as it gives me something to look forward to each week. Knowing that I am supporting someone in the community feels very rewarding and positive.

Emergency Response Volunteer

I have experience of working in events management and meet and greet but due to health difficulties, I had to take a step back from working to take care of myself. As my health has improved, I was determined to start volunteering as a positive next step into employment.

It is a great opportunity to meet people and make a real positive difference and hopefully inspire others to do the same.

Where do you volunteer? Covid-19 Response Volunteer

What do you do as a volunteer? I help guide the public to the correct entrance to the venue, assist those who have mobility difficulties, take temperatures, ask Covid-19 relevant questions. Help to reassure patients who have concerns about having the vaccine. Work as part of a team helping to make everything run smoothly.

Why do you like volunteering? It really gives me a sense of purpose knowing that I am supporting the NHS and the local community. Volunteering is a great opportunity to engage with people and everyone is so grateful for the support they have, when they come to get their vaccines.

It has helped me to get out and about after many years, due health difficulties; I lost my self confidence and self-esteem. On the days I am volunteering I start the day in an enthusiastic and positive way and really look forward to my volunteering role. I would recommend it!

Ross-on-Wye & Monmouth Sea Cadets

Description: Ross-on-Wye and Monmouth Sea Cadet Unit is a youth organisation, which caters for young people from 10 to 18 years of age. We are a registered charity which is run purely by volunteers.

We are a uniformed youth organisations and our training is based on a nautical theme. We also teach life skills such as teamwork, first aids and catering. Well also offer practical skills both on the land and water. We meet twice a week as well as offering week and weekend activities.

Fundraising Officer - As a Fundraising Officer, you will also be part of the Committee. Ideally you will have experience of writing funding applications / applying for funding.

Administration Support - You will be supporting the instructional team, by ensuring that communications are sent out, personal records are kept up to date and people are book onto relevant courses. Full training will be given.

Survivors of Bereavement by Suicide (SoBS)

Description: Survivors of Bereavement (SOBS) is a registered charity that was founded in 1991 by Alice Middleton MBE. Following the death of her brother and finding little support available, she placed an advert in her local paper seeking to make contact with others who had been bereaved by suicide. She started the first support group from her living room in Hull.

We have grown to become the only national charity providing dedicated support to adults who have been bereaved by suicide.

We are a volunteer, peer-led organisation, and our growing number of volunteers across the UK deliver our support services, raise funds for our work, increase awareness and get involved in local suicide prevention strategies.

The majority of our volunteers have been bereaved by suicide themselves and this experience helps them to empathise and connect with others.

New Group Facilitators We are looking to recruit volunteer Group Facilitators (minimum of 3 per group) who would be interested in establishing a new peer-led support group in their local area.

The purpose of the role is

- To provide a vital peer to peer support service for those who find themselves in need of support following the loss of someone through suicide

Frequently asked Questions

Can I volunteer?

Yes, anyone can volunteer. In fact, we encourage all to offer their time to support their local voluntary groups and organisations.

Who do I contact?

Once you have found a volunteer role you are interested in you need to contact the group/organisation directly.

When can I start?

This can vary. Once you have been in touch with a group/organisation about a volunteer role they will discuss a start date with you.

What skills do I need?

Very often no specific skills are required, and full training will be given. If a role requires specific skills these will be mentioned in the volunteer description.

What training will be given?

You should be given an induction when you start, and any health and safety training required. You may also be given training specific for the volunteer role.

I am under 18

There are a range of opportunities for younger people. All of these are listed on our website. We will also be holding an event on volunteering for the under 18s later on in the year.
