2023 Brought A Great Deal of Change to the Presbytery

Merry Christmas and happy New Year from the Winnebago Presbytery staff. Thank you for all the ways that we work together to be faithful!

If the first half of 2023 had us focusing on learning about and voting on 33 amendments brought forward by the 2022 General Assembly, **the second half of this year was a time to implement the many changes.**

Winnebago Presbytery held 5 meetings in 2023 to enable the discussion, voting, and implementation of the amendments. The meetings were held successfully by 4 hybrid (in-person and by Zoom) events 1 Zoom meeting. The meetings in January, March, and May focused on learning about and voting on the amendments. The September and November meetings addressed how to implement the changes to the Book of Order. These changes included:

- The Presbytery, from different angles including the Personnel Committee and Commission on Ministry, implemented the new Paid Family Medical Leave provision of the *Book of Order* through approval of new minimum terms of call for 2024 and an approved revision of the presbytery's Personnel Policies;

- A harassment policy was drafted, discussed, and approved;
- Still to come - antiracism policy.

The new Church Leadership Connection (CLC) that helps match churches looking for pastors with new leaders was launched. All active Pastor Nominating Committees were quickly up and active on the new system.

Congratulations to First Presbyterian Church of Fond du Lac for successfully navigating the new system and electing a new pastor!

Conversations with Milwaukee and John Knox Presbyteries began at our invitation. Two specific actions are being drafted or explored:

- With John Knox's Presbytery Administrator set to retire in February, plans have been developed (though not yet approved) for Winnebago and John Knox to share one staff person to provide administrative support to both presbyteries;
- A three-week devotional available for January.

After a few attempts, email and

phone issues, we were finally able to launch a brand new website going into 2024. It is our hope that the new website will enhance continued communication, foster new community engagement, and provide resources in a more user-friendly design.

We've also revamped our digital newsletter *News & Notes* for 2024 to further reflect all of the changes we've embraced this year.
