Today was the 41st delivery of groceries to 43 families facing food insecurity in the barrio of the Church of San Benito de Nursia in San Cristobal, Chiapas.

Last week we reported on the catechism classes in Yochib and San Cristobal, and it was mentioned that at San Mateo in Yochib the children usually have follow-up activities organized by Carlos. Here's a glimpse of the class May 21st as reported from Carlos.

"When we arrived, we found 33 children in the class with Father Florencio inside the church. We went through our health protocol (gel and disinfectant), and we split the group in two (small children and older children). Today's project was to draw the church they would like to have and to talk about what we could do to achieve it. The older children gave a talk to tell the others what it meant to participate in the church and what the church meant for them. At the end the little ones made a mural that combined their drawings from last week, and we posted it on the wall. When they finished, they were given a breakfast of tamales and juices (the tamales were a big hit); then the older ones cleaned the church and disinfected the pews."
