- **PortMiami:** USCG has established condition ZULU at PortMiami. The tunnel, waterside traffic, and cargo terminals are closed for any inbound and outbound activity until further notice. For the latest updates, please visit www.portmiami.biz
- **PortEverglades:** USCG established condition ZULU. Port will be closed as of 17:01 or 5:01 PM this evening, Sunday, November 8. A determination regarding when the Port will return to normal business operations will be made following further review of the storm's development over the next 24 hours.
- **Miami International Airport:** MIA remains open. Generally, airlines pause operations before sustained crosswinds reach 35+ mph. The FAA & MIA towers don't operate in sustained winds of 55+ mph. Please contact your carrier for flight status.
