


Friday Keynote Speaker: Cassie Stephens



Bio: After spending entirely too long at Indiana University getting her degree in both painting and art education, Cassie Stephens did her student teaching in the magical land of Ireland. While she was away, her parents, fully aware of her slacker ways, sent out 52 art teacherin' job applications to such far away places as Alaska. One such place that called her for an interview was Nashville,

Tennessee. On a whim, she loaded up her jean-jumpers, resume and chain-smoking grandma to make the trip to

Nashville where she landed her first teaching gig. Fast forward over 25 years and Cassie has settled down with her husband and their three cats. Since 2012, she's been sharing her lessons, creative endeavors and wild and wacky outfits on her blog...which is how she managed to meet and connect with so many amazing and inspiring art educators just like you. After teaching elementary art for 25 years, she's since stepped away from the classroom to continue to share her tips, tricks and techniques in the form of books and videos. Saturday Keynote Speaker: Ginger Williams Cook



Ginger Williams Cook is a painter, published illustrator, and arts educator in Jackson, Mississippi. Her work has been featured internationally in art exhibitions, publications, and brand packaging. She cultivated a passion for teaching art as the former Studio Programs Coordinator and Master Teaching Artist at the Mississippi Museum of Art. She won the Outstanding Museum Art Educator of the Year award in 2012 from MAEA. During her role at the museum, she taught after-school art at Operation Shoestring and Brown Elementary. Ginger also completed two Ask For More Arts residencies, culminating in an

art exhibit for the families and community within JPS.

Nurturing a daily creative practice inspires her to motivate others to connect with an authentic exploration of ideas and art techniques in immersive workshops.

In 2023, Ginger's paintings were exhibited at Ferrara Showman Gallery in New Orleans as a jury-selected finalist and subsequently grand prize award recipient of the 27th Annual No Dead Artists International Juried Exhibition of Contemporary Art. Her solo exhibition and gallery premiere, Abundance of Apollo: The Celestial Gods, Goddesses, and Heroes of Greek Mythology, opened in January 2025. She is currently working on a series of paintings that will show in the gallery in early 2026. Ginger's art studio is in the Historic Fondren District in Jackson, MS. She loves spending time with her husband Justin, kids Eloise and Oliver, and pets Norman and Penny.

Intro to Needle Felting with Cassie Stephens


Cassie began exploring the art of needle felting ten years ago. Since then, she's created an entire wardrobe of needle-felted wears from her Mondrian coat to her The Scream dress to her light-up Starry Night ensemble. Needle felting is similar to painting but with wool roving as your medium.

In this workshop, Cassie will share ways for you to explore this medium both in and out of your art room. Feel free to bring an old sweater or garment that you'd like to use as your needle felted 'canvas'. Or create a needle felted paint palette clip for your apron or your hair! At the end

Energetic Mark Making with Ginger Williams Cook: How to silence your inner critic and activate the right side of the brain



Perfectionism, comparison, and rigidity can stagnate a creative practice. This workshop will focus on the importance of cultivating experimental warm-ups in response to the core attitudes of mindfulness. It will involve tactile movement through non-judgment, patience, a beginner's mind, trust, non-striving, acceptance, and letting go. These attitudes are

essential for a successful mindfulness practice, as they help cultivate an impartial,

curious, and present-moment awareness, allowing one to observe experiences without resistance or attachment to specific outcomes.

The right side of the brain is the source of creativity, imagination, and spatial reasoning. Art produced from a place of curiosity, spontaneity, and joy is magnetic. This workshop will utilize a variety of drawing materials to explore different styles and mark making techniques centered on observation and perception, embracing non-linear thinking, and enhancing spatial awareness.









Quick & Dirty Figurative Bust Sculpting with Christian Bailey



In this workshop, Christian Bailey will lead participants through his process of using a paper armature and soft slabs for sculpting human/animal hybrid figurative busts. You will be guided in how to construct your armature, apply slabs, and sculpt your creature using handbuilding techniques. **Limit 12 participants.**









Christian Bailey is a husband,

a cat dad, an award-winning artist, and art teacher living on the Mississippi Gulf Coast. He earned a BFA in sculpture and a Master's of Education from the University of Southern Mississippi. This is his 19th year as a high school art teacher, teaching art 1, 2, 3, 4, Advanced Placement Studio Art, and ceramics. He is a reader for the College Board AP Studio Art Portfolio. And was the 2024/25 Teacher of the Year for the Harrison County School District. In addition to being a high school art teacher, he maintains a robust studio practice that continuously pushes his boundaries of what clay can do in art. Workshops on clay sculpture, surface decoration techniques for pottery,

glaze mixing, and how to use art in the classroom, round out the rest of his days. He has had a series of solo and group shows around the southeast. Most notably Columbus Arts Council, Hinds Community College, Pearl River Community College, Jones County Junior College, Florida State College of Jacksonville, the Mary C. Cultural Center, and Ohr O'Keefe Museum of Art. He was selected to show at ArtFields for 2023 and 2024. He has been awarded numerous grants for his

work and was a fellowship awardee for 2024 from the Mississippi Arts Commission for his work in sculpture.







Idiom on the Wall/Intro to Oil Painting with Stacey Underwood



Take the mystery out of oil painting by refreshing your memory on how to mix and use oil paints. This workshop is for those who don't use oil paints on a regular basis. You will be reminded how to mix colors and mediums using a limited palette...but there will be other pigments available in case you want to get crazy! Our subject matter will take a cue from local painter Stacy Underwood's current body of work that depicts the idioms we use every day as visual images...think "apples to oranges" (which will be provided should you not want to bring in your own inspirational idiom object). You will leave with a conversational piece for sure! (Odorless Gamsol will be used to thin and clean

brushes.) Limit 20 Participants.



Stacy Underwood lives and works in Jackson. She works primarily in oils and prefers painting portraits





(the one thing she detested most in college). Stacy got her B.A. from the University of Mississippi and has continued her training by attending workshops such as the one she is teaching. Seventeen years ago she founded HeARTWorks, an art program at Stewpot, Mississippi's largest shelter for the unhoused. It is

largely because of her dedication to this community that she was awarded MAEA's Prism Award 10 years ago. Her latest body of work depicting idioms will be on display at the Museum of the Mississippi Delta beginning in November. Stacy's work has been included in the MMA's Mississippi Invitational and is currently represented by Fischer Galleries in Ridgeland.



Fused Glass with Pearl River Glass Conservatory







Back by popular demand, Pearl River Glass Conservatory will offer a concentration in their conservatory studios in Midtown Jackson. Participants will learn about fused glass, gain skills to cut and assemble glass, and create multiple items, such as fused glass tiles and garden stakes to keep.
