

**DID YOU KNOW?**

The flowers painted on the ceiling in 1958, are the work of Mr. Henry LaCagninia of Jupiter and West Palm Beach. The smaller depictions are of the flowers and plants mentioned in the Bible while the larger pieces are local Florida plants and flowers. An anonymous donor provided the funding for the ceiling artwork as well as the addition of the belltower, educational spaces, fellowship hall and kitchen. At that time the whole project cost \$125,000.
