

# Downtown Eugene Activity Mapping

## Call to Volunteers

### WHAT

The City of Eugene seeks a group of volunteers who are invested in the vitality of their community to assist with the evaluation of downtown Eugene's public spaces. Utilizing a method known as "Activity Mapping," this data will be used to build upon the assessment of downtown conducted by the Project for Public Spaces in the Fall of 2016.

We hope to recruit approximately 75 volunteers, and ask that all who sign up commit to 1, hour-long training session, as well as 3, hour-long Activity Mapping sessions within the span of a two-week period.

### WHY

The City of Eugene is working to build a greater sense of safety, vibrancy, inclusivity, and engagement in our downtown spaces. Collecting and comparing this data will allow us to reflect on the outcomes of our current efforts, as well as to guide future planning. To do so, we need your help!
