

RESOURCES FOR HOME INFUSION

Home infusion can be an alternative to ED or infusion centers. IV access can be initiated in the patient's home, including PICC lines, depending on the prescribed therapy. Type of access would need to be confirmed with the vendor. VNA/HHA agencies can assist with coordination and support of infusion services.

Some common home infusions include:

- Hydration
- Anti-Infectives
- TPN
- Immune Globulin therapy.

Referrals may be made by phone or fax and require the following info:

- Demographics (name, address, date of birth, telephone number and SSN)
- Clinical information, including diagnosis (baseline labs may be needed)
- Insurance information (more challenging with Medicare)
- Therapy (drug, dose, and frequency)

Benefit verification takes between 30 minutes and 5 hours. Certain drugs, like Remicade and Entyvio may take longer.
