Program Overview

Your company has the opportunity to compete in the construction industry's premier awards program. The Excellence in Construction Awards recognizes outstanding merit shop projects through a variety of public relations efforts. Use this application to enter your company's best project(s) for a chance to win an Eagle Award!

All Eagle winners will be recognized at the EIC Award Banquet on Friday, April 24, 2026 in Hot Springs. Full event details will be announced soon. The awards ceremony will feature a multi-media presentation highlighting the STEP Award recipients, Eagle Award winners and Legacy Award winners. Winners will also be promoted in various publications and releases through the regional construction-related news media.

Entry Requirements

Each entry must follow the entry requirements outlined in this award application.

Project Safety Requirements

A company that experiences a safety-related fatality of a direct employee in the United States within the current program year is NOT eligible for an Excellence in Construction Award. If a subsidiary is a direct ABC member versus part of a larger holding company member, then the subsidiary with a safety-related fatality is not eligible, but another subsidiary of the same holding company may be. Furthermore, all EIC award winners have a continuing duty to inform ABC of a safety-related fatality that occurred after the end of the current program year until the time of the awards program. Such a fatality will nullify the EIC award. After the judging process and prior to the awards program, ABC will request that an award winner confirm that a safety-related fatality did not occur. Failure to respond to the request will also nullify the EIC award.

A company that experienced a safety-related fatality of a direct employee in the United States within two or three years of the current program year is required to provide additional information regarding action that has been taken following the fatality.

No project that involves prime, multi-prime or sub-trade contractors with a safety-related fatality is eligible to be considered for an award.

Completion of Project Requirement

To be eligible for award consideration, the project itself must have been completed between April 1, 2024 and December 31, 2025.

Project Entry Steps

- Project Registration- Each project must have this completed application to ABC Arkansas by December 12, 2025.
 If you wish to submit multiple projects, please feel free to copy this form or download it at www.abcark.org.
 Once received, we will provide your company with a project binder(s) with full project submission details. There is no limit to how many projects a company may enter.
- 2. **Project Entry Fee** Each project application must be submitted with a \$400 check made payable to ABC Arkansas. Project Entry Fees are non refundable.
- 3. **Mail Completed Project Binder** All project binders must be dropped off or mailed to the ABC Arkansas office by Friday, **February 6, 2026**.

Judging

Projects will be judged by a team of unbiased industry experts from UALR's Construction Management Department. Entries will be evaluated on the material submitted and will consider attractiveness of design, complexity, workmanship, innovation, unusual challenges or problems overcome, etc. ABC Arkansas reserves the right to change the category of an entry if it believes a company's chances of winning may be enhanced.

Project Binder 'Best Practices'

A well composed project binder is a key component to winning an EIC Award. Several years ago, we hosted a workshop designed to help members understand the judges' expectations and how to prepare the ideal project binder. Also at this workship, past EIC Winners and ABC staff had the opportunity to share their tips and best practices. ABC took the information derived from the workshop and has put together a "cheat sheet" of the do's and don't's of completeing your binder. Whether you've entered projects in the past or if this is your first time entering a project, this "cheat sheet" will serve as a great tool to help perfect your binder and increase your chances of winning one of the coveted Eagle Awards! This sheet will be included in your project binder, along with the instructions. Members will receive their project binder once we have received their completed EIC Application. STEP & AQC

Whether your company is beginning its' safety journey or continuing to strengthen its' safety performance, ABC National's Safety Training Evaluation Process (STEP) will provide you with the direction you need to reach world-class. Participating in STEP provides you with an opportunity to measure your safety program's progress through the 20 Key Components self-evaluation, identify areas of improvement and benchmark your performance with fellow ABC members.

FOR YOUR EIC PROJECT BINDER:

There will be a section in your project binder that pertains to Safety. In this section, points will be awarded to Members who provide proof of receiving a STEP award in 2025. You may include a copy of your submission receipt or a copy of your award certificate. To request a copy of your 2025 Award certificate, contact megan@abcark.org. Physical certificates will be presented to winning companies at a later date. To apply for 2025 STEP, visit www.abcstep.org. (Deadline for 2025 application is December 15th.)

LOCAL STEP RECOGNITION:

The ABC National STEP program is conducted annually and Members can apply year round. We encourage all Members to apply for STEP every year that they want to make a commitment to achieving world-class safety performance. In order to recognize National STEP winners on a local level, our Chapter will recognize the previous year's STEP winners during our EIC Awards Ceremony. Meaning, 2025 STEP recipients will be recognized at the EIC Awards Banquets on April 24, 2026. All 2026 STEP recipients will be recognized at the EIC Awards Ceremony in 2027.

Following STEP, companies can apply to become an Accredited Quality Contractor. The Accredited Quality Contractor Program is an ABC National program which publicly recognizes and honors those construction firms which have documented their commitment in five key areas of corporate responsibility: Quality; Safety (STEP Gold, Platinum or Diamond Level Required); Employee Benefits; Training; Community Relations and Diversity. Benefits of participating in this program include a wide recognition within the industry, the business community, and the public; National and local recognition in publications; authorization to use AQC language in bid documents; permission to use the AQC logo on letterhead, business cards and jobsite signs; and points on National Excellence in Construction Awards submissions for being AQC certified. Project Award General Category Descriptions

Mega-Projects	includes all projects more than \$100 million, regardless of type, whether General Contractor or Construction Management.
Commercial	includes office buildings, banks, retail facilities, hotels or mixed use buildings.
Community/Public Service	includes philanthropic projects, regardless of type, that enhanced the community, using substantial resources donated by the contractor. Entries should include information detailing the donated resources.
Federal Government/Military	includes all projects owned by the Federal Government, with the exception of transportation infrastructure and utilities.
Healthcare	hospitals, assisted living, nursing homes and other licensed medical facilities.
Historical Restoration/Renovation	restoration of buildings that are registered as historical, or are eligible to be registered as historical, on a state or the national registry of historic places.
Industrial	category covers manufacturing plants and facilities, refineries and similar types of construction.
Infrastructure: Heavy	covers projects streets or highways, dams, bridges and parks.
Institutional	covers buildings built for colleges, elementary or secondary schools, churches, local government structures; with the exception of healthcare facilities.
Pre-Engineered Building	encompasses commercial, industrial and institutional building projects where the primary structure is a pre-engineered metal building. Previous winners include an indoor skating complex, a boat manufacturing plant and an office/warehouse facility. Entries should include information regarding the extent of the project this is pre-engineered (i.e. are there conventional components or portions of the building?) The contractors role on the project (i.e. supply and erect steel, general contractor or design/builder) and why a pre-engineered building was utilized.
Public Works/Environment	covers water treatment plants and sewage treatment plants.
Renovation / Restoration	includes the renovation or restoration of non-historical, existing buildings with more than 50 percent of square footage that has been renovated or restored.
Other Construction	includes construction not specifically referred to in the above, such as theme parks, skate parks, water parks, zoos, and other unique types of projects.

Project Award Specialty Category Descriptions

Community/Public Service	includes philanthropic projects, regardless of type, that enhanced the community, using substantial resources donated by the contractor. Entries should include information detailing the donated resources.
Electrical	covers any electrical contract more than \$10 million.
Electrical: Commercial	includes electrical systems and utilities in a facility built for the benefit of people comfort and occupancy such as: office buildings, hospitals, schools, shopping centers, call centers, multi- family residential, hotels, convention centers, fountain features in a commercial facility, sports arena and stadium, parking lots, medical laboratories or renovation in an existing facility.
Electrical: Industrial	includes electrical systems built for the purpose of facilitating processes or manufacturing. Examples are manufacturing plants, processing plants, clean rooms, data centers, printing and processing centers, airports, animal facilities or electrical renovation in an existing industrial facility.
Electrical: Low Voltage	includes installation of low voltage electrical systems such as structured cabling systems, total integration systems, network inegration systems, access control systems, paging & intercom systems, nurse call systems, CCTV network systems, access control systems, and wireless connectivity.
Mechanical	covers any mechanical contract more than \$10 million.
Mechanical: Commercial	covers mechanical systems in a facility built for the benefit of people comfort and occupancy such as office buildings, hospitals, schools, shopping centers, call centers, multi-family residential, hotels, convention centers, fountain features in a commercial facility, sports arenas and stadiums, medical laboratories or mechanical renovation in an existing commercial facility.
Mechanical: Industrial	covers mechanical systems built for the purpose of facilitating processes or manufacturing. Examples are manufacturing plants, processing plants, clean rooms, data centers, printing and processing centers, animal facilities or mechanical renovation in an existing industrial facility.
Fire Protection	includes installation of fire alarm systems, fire sprinkler systems, fire suppression systems, or special hazard systems.
Sitework/Landscape/Hardscape	covers interior or exterior landscaping and parking lots.
Exteriors	includes masonry, precast, stone and all other exterior finishes.
Interiors	areas to include but not limited to are as follows: metal stud and gypsum, ceiling finishes, painting and wall coverings, other wall finishes and flooring. It is our intent to award based on degree of complexity and high end finishes showcasing the abilities.
Other Speciality Construction	covers construction not specifically referred to in the above specialty categories, such as roofing, fountain features or artistic scaffolding.

Project Entry Qualifications, Rights and Agreement
