- Review scientific literature, manuscripts and clinical studies as requested by the Commissioner to assess evidence, validity and reliability in order to provide assessments as to whether materials are consistent with agency goals;
- Provide critical analysis of literature that relates to measurement and tracking of disparities, evidence-based approaches to promoting health equity;
- Summarize strategic approaches to realize agency commitment to disparities reduction;
- Draft commentary/review letters and articles for publication in peer-reviewed literature;
- Participate in compilation and statistical analysis of Agency data;
- Collaborate with Agency leaders to develop, review, and evaluate public health policies; and
- Work with partners to design and implement complex public health projects; and
- Participate in special projects and workgroups as assigned.

Preferred Skills

- Master of Public Health (MPH) required unless a candidate has an MD and relevant clinical experience. Greater consideration will be given to candidates with both an MPH and a doctorate degree from an accredited college or university;
- Demonstrated experience in multiple public health policy and clinical areas, including chronic disease prevention, maternal child health and or health systems management;

Medical Officer GP-602-14 and/or Epidemiologist GS-601-14

This opportunity is open to individuals who qualify in the 601 or 602 series at the GS-14 level and Commissioned Corps equivalent.

The International Epidemiology and Response Team (IERT) in the Epidemiology and Prevention Branch, Influenza Division, National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases seeks a medical officer or epidemiologist to be based in Bangkok, Thailand. This is a non-supervisory position. The incumbent will report to the Influenza Program Director in the CDC-Southeast Asia Regional Office, and will work in close partnership with the staff of the CDC Southeast Asia Regional Influenza Program. The CDC-Southeast Asia Regional Influenza Program works with foreign ministerial, US government, and international development partners to support influenza surveillance, pandemic preparedness, and policy-relevant applied science. These activities are undertaken with CDC's objectives of increasing global health security and US domestic preparedness through reducing the impact of seasonal epidemics and pandemics globally; reducing the burden of influenza among persons through the development of an evidence base to support best practices in vaccination, treatment, non-pharmaceutical interventions, and surveillance; by evaluating innovative and practical strategies to improve vaccination; and by building capacity for epidemic and pandemic preparedness and response.

POSITION DUTIES: This position will support CDC Southeast Asia Regional Influenza Program to meet its mandate of supporting high quality influenza surveillance, epidemiologic and vaccine research, program monitoring and evaluation, and pandemic preparedness and response. This position will support work to build these capacities in selected countries in the Asia-Pacific region. The incumbent will work with the staff of the CDC-Southeast Asia Regional Influenza Program, ministerial partners, IERT staff, partners in additional CDC CIOs, and additional USG and international development partners. In these roles the incumbent and will be expected to:

- Evaluate and optimize influenza sentinel surveillance and coordinate with animal-human interface surveillance platforms in order to document best practices, and to strengthen their local utility and sustainability
- Develop, support, and/or implement applied research projects to improve influenza prevention, control/management and response (e.g., applied science to determine disease burden, assess/monitor disease severity, improve vaccination programs, and assess the cost-effectiveness of interventions).
- Provide medical and/or epidemiologic expertise to ministries of health, WHO, academia, and other relevant partners in Thailand and throughout the Asia Pacific region
- Provide situational awareness of global influenza activity
- Develop and implement rapid response trainings, epidemic and pandemic simulation exercises
- Support laboratory and epidemiologic technology transfer to local partners for rapid identification and analysis of influenza viruses
- Support epidemiologic investigations of public health problems, including acute outbreaks and clusters of illness and other threats to health upon request
- Provide training and capacity development for local epidemiologists
- Facilitate the successful operationalization of current CDC cooperative agreements
- Support and lead the publication of best practices to detect, prevent, and respond to epidemic and pandemic influenza
- Implement and expand upon opportunities for collaboration on specific activities of public health importance with strategic direction from the CDC SE Asia Influenza Program Director.

REQUIRED SKILLS:

- Broad and deep knowledge of principles, practices, and methodology and techniques in public health and epidemiology, with good quantitative skills.
- Proven history of completing projects and publishing scientific work
- Advanced degree in medicine, epidemiology or public health from a recognized university.
- Minimum of five years' experience in an epidemiological field or equivalent.

- Computer skills in data analyses software, word processing, spreadsheets and presentation software.

DESIRED QUALIFICATION CRITERIA: The incumbent should have a strong scientific record and subject matter expertise in influenza epidemiology in order to provide authoritative guidance on seasonal and pandemic influenza epidemiology, treatment and control to Ministries of Health and other partners in the region. The incumbent should have strong interpersonal and diplomatic skills as well as experience of interacting with staff from Ministries of Health, interpreting data for policy needs, and working experience in cross-cultural environments. Experience in working with international USG development partners and WHO is a plus. Medical/clinical and/or laboratory experience is a plus. Teaching and training experience in epidemiology and public health is plus. Experience implementing an international project for CDC from an international location and/or international program management is preferred.

OTHER:
