- Draft commentary/review letters and articles for publication in peer-reviewed literature;
- Participate in compilation and statistical analysis of Agency data;
- Collaborate with Agency leaders to develop, review, and evaluate public health policies; and

The Division of Pediatric Pulmonology at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, MI is recruiting a full-time Clinical Instructor or Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatric Pulmonology with strong clinical and teaching skills. The rank of the selected candidate will depend upon candidate's qualifications. Candidates must be BC/BE in Pediatric Pulmonology.

The Division of Pediatric Pulmonology is currently comprised of ten board-certified pediatric pulmonologists (one of whom who is also board-certified in sleep) and four nurse practitioners. The Division provides inpatient care for children at C.S. Mott Children's Hospital in Ann Arbor. In addition to caring for patients on the pediatric pulmonary service, the Division provides care for a 10-bed Pediatric Ventilator Unit for patients requiring long term ventilation, and an active consult service that sees patients in the pediatric and neonatal intensive care units, pediatric cardiothoracic unit, subspecialty services and general pediatrics service.

The Division is also responsible for a busy outpatient practice that cares for patients with asthma, cystic fibrosis, BPD, chronic respiratory failure, primary ciliary dyskinesia, congenital lung abnormalities, neuromuscular and aerodigestive disorders, interstitial lung disease and other pulmonary illnesses. Worthy of special mention are the Cystic Fibrosis Center, which cares for 263 children, the Home Ventilator Program, which cares for 213 patients receiving technology-assisted home care, and the Pediatric Asthma Wellness Program. In addition, we have a state-of-the-art pulmonary function laboratory, a full sleep lab and a very active bronchoscopy service. The Division staffs Michigan Medicine clinics in Ann Arbor, Northville, Brighton, Ypsilanti, and Mt. Pleasant. Candidates will be expected to participate in clinical care, teaching of medical students, residents and three Pediatric Pulmonology fellows and quality improvement. Participation in research, including CF and asthma clinical trials, is also supported. Pediatric pulmonologists with experience in sleep disorders are encouraged to apply.

The Division of Cardiothoracic Surgery at Washington University offers a unique training opportunity for graduated medical students, surgical residents, and postdoctoral fellows interested in Cardiac and Thoracic Surgery research. Dr. James L. Cox established the division's research laboratory in 1983, and since then we have trained 114 surgeon-scientists from around the world. This laboratory is led by well-established, world-renowned investigators researching a wide range of clinical and basic scientific problems that originate in cardiac and thoracic surgery. These include: Surgical Treatment and Mechanisms of Arrhythmias (Dr. Damiano); The Role of the Adaptive Immune System in Lung Allograft Rejection, The Role of Donor Innate Immune Responses in Regulating Alloimmunity after Heart Transplantation (Dr. Kreisel); Underlying Mechanism in the Development of Hypoplastic Left Heart Syndrome (Dr. Eghtesady) Inflammatory Mechanisms in Postoperative Atrial Fibrillation (Dr. Melby); Innate Immune Response in Lung Transplantation (Dr. Gelman); and patient outcomes research, Optimizing Donor Management in Lung Transplantation (Drs. These projects are conducted in collaboration with faculty in Vascular Surgery, Public Health Sciences, Cardiology, Pulmonary Medicine, Radiology, Genetics, and Biomedical Engineering. These investigators are all well-funded and presently have over \$20 million of NIH funding and VA Merit Review grants. This position is supported by the division's NIH Institutional National Research Service award (T32). This training grant provides full salary support for qualified individuals for a two-year period beginning July 1, 2021.

Ophthalmology Career Development Opportunities with Genentech

The current efforts include development of the first bispecific antibody treatment for intraocular use, faricimab, which targets both simultaneously and independently Ang2 and VEGF, two molecules that are key in the pathophysiology of several retinal diseases, the novel port-delivery system for ranibizumab extends durability of ranibizumab efficacy in retina and eliminates the need for frequent patient office visits and injections. We are also actively researching novel treatments in dry AMD and geographic atrophy, glaucoma and dry eye. Among additional exciting research and development projects, Genentech is also pursuing gene therapy and other novel intraocular delivery approaches, and development of diagnostic and predictive tools involving A.I.
