## AgeOptions Advocacy Task Force Members Meet with Representative on Older Americans Act

Members of the AgeOptions Advocacy Task Force met with U.S. Representative Raja Krishnamoorthi in August to talk about the upcoming reauthorization of the Older Americans Act (OAA). First enacted in 1965 and reauthorized every decade, the OAA was the first federal level initiative aimed at providing comprehensive services for older adults.

With the OAA up for reauthorization in 2019, Bill Benson and Kendra Kuehn of Health Benefits ABCs advised the Advocacy Task Force to reach out to Congressman Krishnamoorthi, who serves on the U.S. House Committee on Education and the Workforce, which has jurisdiction over the Older Americans Act. Benson is a former staff director for the Senate Labor Subcommittee on Aging and oversaw the successful reauthorization of the OAA in 1992.

At the meeting in Rep. Krishnamoorthi's Schaumburg District Office, Advocacy Task Force members discussed how the OAA works in his district and asked that he continue to be on the authorizing House committee and be an advocate for OAA programs.
