Notes from the Transitional Executive Leader

Dear all,

I know many of you are preparing, reading or waiting to read Annual Reports of your churches this month and next. I've heard several pastors comment about January being its own kind of busy ... while November and December usher in Advent and Christmas seasons, January can seem like a month of business, reports, budgets and more.



I'm in a similar place with preparing for our next Presbytery meeting, annual statistics for the denomination, setting goals for the year, budgets and answering all the inquiring minds questions about mileage reimbursement rates, Board of Pension dues and many other details of the daily life of being a Presbytery and a Presbyterian Church.

As I approach nearly three years in what may be and seem like the longest transition ever, I am taking some stock of my own ministry but also looking forward and back as to what we/you have done and accomplished as a Presbytery, as well as what is left to be done in this time of transition, and what is God requiring of us. I will not begin to account for all that has been done, but here are a few examples. Feel free to add to the list with your own articles and reports.

- We sent three capable and willing leaders/participants to General Assembly in 2022. Two of them served as committee leadership. Thank you to Doris, Khyah and Patrice!
- 2. Khyah Van Es and Emma Johnston embarked on life changing and transformative work as Young Adult Volunteers for the PCUSA
- 3. The Trustees provided a number of scholarships to our YAVs and also Westminster Woods Campers
- 4. Several of our churches celebrated milestone birthdays

- 5. We honored the retirement of John Wilson, Independence
- 6. We mourned and celebrated the lives of significant teaching and ruler elder leaders from this Presbytery
- 7. We received new pastors at several of our churches (Pratt, Trinity-Wichita, First-Wichita-interim, McPherson, and in late 2021 Hutchinson First)
- 8. The Trustees and the AC and I worked with Holcomb to make the difficult decision to close the church and sell their building. This was done with grace and efficiency
- 9. We said goodbye to New Covenant, Hutchinson and released them to EPC
- 10. The Presbytery office building was sold and our staff moved to remote working at home.

When I consider where I started, which was right at the beginning of the Covid pandemic, I'm astonished that we could do what we have been able to do. These items are not an exhaustive list, but an exhausting one! The accomplishments also are not the whole picture. There is much for which we need to pray and many areas of gaps in leadership and possibly an exhaustion and weariness from all that has been endured over these three years.

So where do we go? What do we do? Why do we exist as a unit, a body, a Presbytery, a community of faith, a gathering of disciples? I do not have the answer but I believe collectively, WE have the answer. At our February meeting, I want to be able to share with you some resources we DO have. I do not want to depress myself or your with all the areas of deficit, but I hope that I can energize us and remind us of what is available so that we might look at 2023 as a year to dream, to envision, to follow God's call to "Do Justice, Love Kindness and Walk Humbly With God." Then, at our next meeting, with the blessing of PCT and some added help and resources, we can meet together and form interest groups to begin to put together ideas and plans that put meat and flesh on the dry bones.
