

Thais Perkins, M.S. has been an academic researcher, environmental regulator, traveling songwriter, nonprofit executive and educator, and now is the creator and owner of Reverie Books in Austin. Raised in rural Louisiana, her life story represents a personal journey of resisting the biases of the Deep South and finding purpose in education and community support of young people, most recently through the establishment of an independent bookstore. Drawing on her experience as a singer/songwriter, activist, environmentalist and mother, Thais shares her story of creating a bookstore that seeks to build community and create a safe space where everyone can feel welcome.

## **Policy Update from the Public Policy Committee**

Cathy is our committee's point person for climate change, and for our last meeting she shared a link to some good information from the Sierra Club about a variety of environmental/climate-related issues we can follow and support: Campaigns | Help Wildlife, Protect the Environment, Support Nature Conservation, Save the Planet (sierraclub.org). I bet you can find a couple of actions that you want to support! Some are Texas specific!



Per <u>EARTHDAY.ORG</u>, here are five common excuses many people make to not vote on Election Day. How can we respond to them? With many candidates this year running on themes of sustainability and environmental issues, making sure as many people get out there and vote will influence the policy decisions made for decades to come.

- 1. "My district is deep red/blue: my vote won't matter!"
- 2. "None of the candidates interest me!"
- 3. "I'm busy that day, I won't have time to go to the polls!"
- 4. "The system is rigged against me, it's flawed to its core!"
- 5. "I'm just one person, I can't influence anything on my own!"



EARTHDAY.ORG's campaign <u>Vote Earth</u> goes far beyond the process of actually voting. The fight against climate change is just as much a shift in culture as it is a shift in the policies that enable action. Talking to your friends and family about the truths about climate change <u>no matter how challenging that may be</u> is vital to maintaining an informed and motivated voting population. There is no other issue a candidate can run on that is as fundamental to the long-term habitability of our planet. Even though one vote on its own can hardly affect the outcome of an election, thousands of 'one votes' can.




