INDIANAPOLIS EXTENSION CENTER

Since the early 1990s, nearly 20,000 Chin have settled in the southern area of Indianapolis, Indiana, USA. These refugees fled persecution in the Chin State in Myanmar. Indianapolis Southside Church of the Nazarene invited a Chin congregation to meet in their facility, resulting in a close relationship between the two. A number of people in the Chin





community expressed a desire for formal biblical and pastoral training. Plans for an extension center in Indianapolis were drawn up by leaders at Southeast Asia Nazarene Bible College (SEANBC) in Bangkok, Thailand, providing courses for pastors. Students view online lectures (in Burmese) individually, then meet collectively once a week. The Bible school is open to all Chin church leaders, whether they are within the Nazarene denomination or not. Southside Pastor Ray McCrary said, "Our congregation has gained an outward focus we did not have before. This has influenced the way we think about immigrants and their needs...I praise God for giving us this privilege of getting to know our neighbors and serving our changing community."

Understanding Urgency



"Eternity rides on your audacity to boldly and intentionally engage people for the Kingdom of God."

As he sat at the stop light he had a decision to make; turn left to go home or turn right and keep a promise. Mark, a church planter friend of mine, had recently made the commitment to God to engage people with the gospel for one hour every day. He had just got off the road from a 5-day trip, it was 9:00 pm and all he wanted to do was sleep. "God, I am so tired, what difference is one night going to make?" Mark was on the verge of choosing home when the Holy Spirit spoke to His heart, "It's ok for you to go home as long as it is ok with you that these people will go to hell." With a surge of urgency, Mark went to the people. That night he prayed with 6 people and led them into faith in Jesus.

We unfortunately approach church with a vender mentality. We walk up, look for what we want, shake the machine a little bit, and when it doesn't give us what we desire, we kick it and walk away mad.

We have developed the vendor mentality because we have forgotten Jesus' urgency when He said He would build His Church. Jesus said the purpose of the Church was to tell the world that He alone is the savior of the world. He saves us from sin, He saves us from self-destruction, and yes, He saves us from hell. There are approximately 160,000 people who live on the westside of Wichita. Statistically, 54% of them have no church home, no religious affiliation, and no relationship with Christ. The statistics are the same for your community as well.

We are planting PaxCity because we believe there is no greater healing than the peace that comes from the gospel of Jesus Christ. We believe that God desires every person to be saved, therefore we take Christ's gospel to every person. We take this gospel to the soul, city, and beyond. We believe, in Jesus, we have the greatest answer to all of life's greatest questions. We have the greatest healing to life's greatest hurts. We have the greatest restoration for life's broken pieces. If we have that healing and fail to take it to those who need it, it will be because we lost our sense of urgency and have chosen the vendor mentality.

Leading change and planting a church starts with a Christ centered sense of urgency for the lost and broken of our neighbors and communities.

But how can they call on him to save them unless they believe in him?

And how can they believe in him if they have never heard about him?
