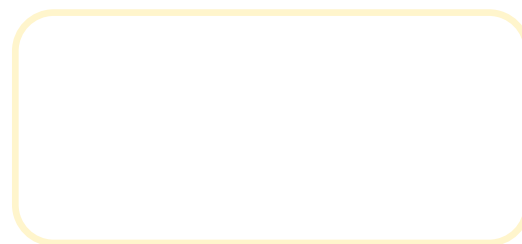

The Battle for Patience

Parents are trying to find daycare for kids as they work, teachers trying to juggle students in school, and preparing lessons that work for those online at the same time. Kids not being able to go out and just play. It is hard for kids, no matter their age. Tempers can flare.

It is not just the young families that are impacted. With all these extras, it costs older members of the family time with their loved ones. Let's face it; there are only so many hours in the day. When you get isolated, you can feel forgotten. That hurts. It can lead to anger turned inward, which is depression. Paul's words above bring us the strength to cope with this. We do not have to let the old flesh win, which lives in the spirit of anger and aloneness as it seeks to divide from others. It is not easy. Paul says it is going to be a battle. These desires do work against God's desires. At first, the anger feels good like you are winning, but in fact, it is a lie. Anger only separates us. Everyone loses when that happens. The answer to this is to fight with the Spirit! We walk in Him! After all, God sealed us with the Holy Spirit in our baptism. Why this gift? Because it is the Spirit that proceeds from the Father and the Son.

That sounds complicated, but it is not. It gives us the greatest help. The Holy Spirit helps us walk together as the Father and Son do. Oh, how the Father loves the Son. Oh, how the Son loves the Father. There is perfect peace between them. If anyone can give us peace, it is this Spirit who helps us walk in the same peace with others. There is one thing: that other person I am trying to walk with is a sinner. Well, so are you. But that is why the Father sent the Spirit. He longed to be

with us in peace again despite the fact we are sinners. That was why the Son came, to take care of sin so we can walk with the Father again. They are both about helping us walk in peace with others. It does mean putting up with their stubbornness, their meanness, their unreasonable ways. It means putting up with people who can be a real burden. Once again, that is why we need the Spirit who comes from the Son! He is the great burden-bearer, the one who bore all our sins. Patience; what a word. It means to bear a burden and not quite on that person. Yes, it is a fruit of the Spirit who alone can give us the grace by joining us to Jesus who walks with us. He is the one who bears the burden, but he does it through us. With him, yes, you can do all things through his strength as Paul reminds us in Philippians 4.

So walk with the Spirit! Live in patience with others in these days. Let them behold the grace of God in you. Let them see the gospel in action, a gospel that brings peace and patience.

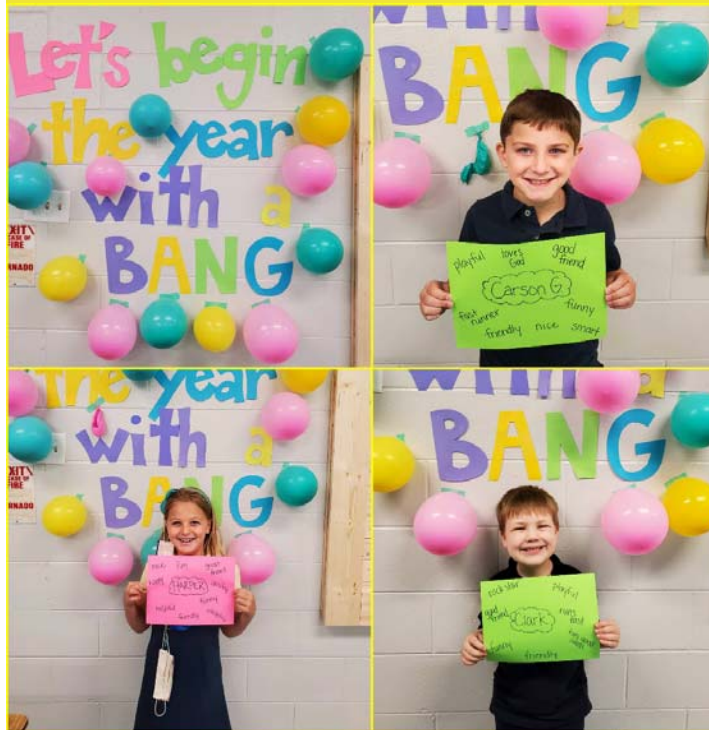

A Special Appeal on Behalf of Lutheran Institute in Madagascar

Over the last several years, ministries of the Mid-South District have been blessed to get to know and support the Lutheran Institute of Management and Entrepreneurship (LIME) in Madagascar. Led by the Rev. Dr. Joseph Randrianasolo, who addressed the delegation of our District's 2018 Convention, LIME offers Malagasy adults (both lay and clergy) the opportunity for advanced studies as part of a three-year curriculum which includes Biblical courses. But like many organizations, businesses and individuals, LIME has been hit especially hard by the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. Graduating its last class in January of this year, the Institute's doors have now been closed for six months. With no tuition coming into the school, Rev. Dr. Joseph Randrianasolo has shared that **the six staff members of LIME and their families now face a dire situation: the very real possibility of starvation.**

In a recent message to Mid-South District President Rev. Dr. Roger Paavola, Rev. Joseph noted that the staff have stretched their resources as far as they can, but that the coming month will be marked by extreme hunger—or worse—without the help of outside aid. In response to this critical need of our Lutheran brothers and sisters in Madagascar, the Mid-South District is sending support and inviting ministries and individuals across the district to do the same. Donations to benefit the staff of LIME and their families can be made [on the Mid-South District web-site](https://mid-southlcms.org) (mid-southlcms.org, "Give Now" link) or by check. All funds directed to the Mid-South District will be wired promptly to LIME in Madagascar.

The six families impacted by the economic crisis of COVID-19 include a total of 13 children. In the past, ministries and individuals across the Mid-South District have shown tremendous support for LIME, its staff and students by funding significant technology and facility upgrades at the Institute. We pray for another overwhelming show of support to help our Lutheran friends in Madagascar face this new difficulty.
