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Mr. Westrick currently serves as the Director for the Pentagon's Engineering and Construction Division supporting and overseeing the Pentagon Reservations design and construction efforts, an active portfolio of over \$300M.

In 1986, he began his engineering career as a Project Engineer for the US Army Corps of Engineers, Baltimore District. He worked on the new automated warehouse for the new Cumberland Army Depot which successfully opened in support of Desert Shield. He then was asked to join the initial Pentagon Renovation (PENREN) Program team that was being formed where he was involved with the Pentagon Reservation Master Planning and the management of design and construction projects associated with the Pentagon's renovation. He finished his PENREN era as the Wedge-1 IPT leader, a \$200M construction effort, and the 1st above ground renovation of the Pentagon which he led to successful completion.

In 2001, he left civil service to join Johnson Controls, Inc. (JCI). During his JCI career, he quickly advanced from Installation Manager to Branch Manager to Regional Manager, to ultimately attain his final position as Director of Operations for JCI's federal business.

In 2016, Mr. Westrick returned to the Pentagon to support Federal Facilities Division as a Senior Engineer working for AECOM. Soon thereafter in 2017, he returned to Government service by accepting a Senior Engineer position within the Pentagon's Engineering and Architecture Division, and shortly after, accepted the Director position for the Pentagon's Engineering and Construction Division in 2018.

Mr. Westrick holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering and a Master of Business Administration (MBA) from Penn State University. He is a licensed professional engineer in the state of Virginia.
